Cell Phones and Text Messaging

Whenever I meet with administrators and teachers from other school districts, one of the "hot topics" is the serious problem that we all are experiencing with cell phones and text messaging. Over the past several weeks, an inordinate amount of my time, Ted's time, and the Level III, IV, and High School Coordinators' time have been devoted to discipline problems related to cell phone use and text messaging during the school day as well as text messages and cyberbullying over the internet off school grounds that spills over into our school. The on-going problems with text messaging and inappropriate MySpace and Facebook entries that have caused students and their families' distress and have resulted in disciplinary consequences at school have prompted the administration to propose a change in the consequences for cell phone use during the school day at tomorrow's School Council meeting. We are asking that the policy be changed from returning the confiscated cell phone to the student's parent/guardian at a meeting with an administrator or Level Coordinator and a Saturday detention to returning the confiscated cell phone to the student's parent/guardian after a week. The parent/guardian would still have to meet with an administrator and, for the first offense, there would still be a Saturday detention. We have shared the proposed change with the faculty and there is consensus that it is a serious problem at SSCPS right now and that we need to tighten up the policy.
