#### FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

#### Attending SSCPS – Priceless!

Over the past several weeks, SSCPS has hosted a number of guests, including, of course, the governor and members of his cabinet. Last week, the head of a school inspection group in the United Kingdom sat in on some classes, toured the building with one of our graduates, and met with Angie, Ted, and me. The reason for his visit – he had asked some people from Class Measures, the organization that sent examiners to SSCPS in October as part of the charter renewal process to identify some schools in Massachusetts that were strong academically and had a project-base focus. We made the list and I must tell you that Jonathan Crossley-Holland was most impressed by what he observed at SSCPS last Wednesday. On Friday,

an aide from State Representative Bradley's office spent about an hour meeting with administrators and parents to learn more about our school and charter schools in general. She also left impressed by all that we have accomplished and acknowledged that there is a positive relationship between our school and local public schools in the area. SSCPS certainly has come a long way from those early years of difficult finances, facility problems, and public district of charter schools!

#### **Last Enrollment Open House, Tomorrow Evening**

The final Enrollment Open House is tomorrow, January 14, from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. Last year we had 400 applications – a record! This year, with all of the wonderful publicity and our continued emphasis upon academics, the arts, Projects and Workshops, and a K-12 Spanish program, we expect another banner year for applications. In order to know the number of anticipated openings we will at each grade level for the lottery, we mail out **the Letter of Intent to Return** to all families each January. The letter will go out tomorrow and you must return it no later than February 10<sup>th</sup>... The lottery this year is Saturday, February 13. The letter of intent constitutes a contract and if we do not have confirmation that you intend for your son or daughter to return to SSCPS next year, we will fill the opening

the day of the lottery. This is an important decision and, if you change your mind after the spot has been filled through the lottery, you would have to resubmit an application and your child's name would go to the bottom of the waitlist. I would also like to remind everyone that if you have a child entering kindergarten next year or a sibling in another grade attending another school this year, you **MUST** fill out an application and submit it by the deadline. This is a STATE requirement and SSCPS, like all charter schools right now, is being closely scrutinized to make certain that we follow all of the state's regulations for our lottery. Of course, we have always followed them but with the legislators expressing concern about the lottery process and how some urban charter schools conduct their lotteries, create their waiting lists, and fill open seats, there will be even greater scrutiny this year.

#### **Executive Director Search**

As you know, at about this time last year, the Board of Trustees and I discussed the possibility of my staying on for a third year as Executive Director. The search committee had not been successful in finding a candidate who was the right fit for SSCPS and there was concern that the economic situation and the fact that the school was up for renewal this year might make it difficult to attract good candidates if a second search was done in the spring. I agreed to stay on, part-time, because I love this school – the students, outstanding faculty and administrators, dedicated and involved parents, and totally supportive Board of Trustees. Bob Gass, Chair of the Personnel Committee and member of the Board, is overseeing the search process for a new Executive Director. The advertisement for the position will be in this Sunday's Globe and in other publications in this state as well as nationally. Please spread the word that SSCPS is looking for an Executive Director, have them check out our website to learn more about us, and, if they are interested in applying, have them contact Kristine Shipps, our Business Manager, for more information about the process and the time-line.

#### 7-12 PRINCIPAL

Throughout the building there is evidence of students working in Projects and Workshops to prepare to demonstrate their knowledge through the Exhibition of Mastery process. High school Workshop students are presenting their Exhibition of Mastery (EOM) projects this week. The expectation is that students will present both orally and in writing evidence of the learning that they are doing in their Workshops to their peers and teachers as well as to outside judges. For some students this is a culminating research project. For others, it is the presentation of a piece of work and reflection about that work. The emphasis is on not just the product, but on students being able to talk about their learning and to publically answer questions concerning their topics of study. One of the great strengths of this school is the ability of students to effectively and comfortably communicate with adults. This is partially because of Exhibitions of Mastery.

Level IV students are laying the foundation for a solid research process for their Exhibitions of Mastery which begin on February 8<sup>th</sup>. The Project Leaders on Level IV are working with students to help them choose appropriate resources and correctly cite them. This is particularly important as our students rely more heavily on Internet-based sources. In class, students are learning about choosing a variety of reliable resources, writing a bibliography, using in-text citations, and outlining. Before the EOMs are due students will also work with their teachers on effective oral presentation techniques.

Particularly exciting for the upcoming round of EOMs is the chance for cross-level work. Marianne Buckley-Curran and June Fontaine, our Project/Workshop Coordinators, are setting up opportunities for students to sit in on the Exhibitions of Mastery of student on other Levels that are about topics related to their own Project or Workshop. This will provide students with a unique occasion to see the work of other students and opens the door for further cross-level collaboration through Projects and Workshops.

Also this week students in grades 7-12 are working hard to hand in their last assignments of the second quarter and to prepare for midterm exams next week. Second quarter grades close on Friday, January 15<sup>th</sup>. The midterm exam schedule is below.
