K-6 PRINCIPAL

Our hearts and our thoughts reach out to the people and the country of Haiti. The devastation caused by the earthquake at 4:35 on Tuesday, January 12, 2010 is beyond imagination. As a school we are close to the suffering with many families of Haitian decent in our community and this past Sunday some of the staff went to church with our families to express our support. The message I heard on Sunday was that love is strong and that together we can find hope even at this time. Earlier I heard that same message of unity and hope in an e-mail sent to me from a parent. This parent wrote, "*My heart aches for my people and my country*. Nothing will ever be the same, but I strongly believe that God must have a plan to make this the turning point we all have been praying for. Our people are resilient and our humble beauty will finally shine for the world to take notice." I read these words as a call to be strong and continue to love. I can not speak directly to what we should all do because right now it seems hard to know exactly what to do for the people of Haiti other than to show solidarity and to contribute what we can financially. Our students did not find themselves in a paralysis of thought but on their own initiative developed a plan to raise cash with a coin drive and we have jars in every room. Please contribute what you can.

Recently we have been getting attention from visiting educators who have heard about our students' accomplishments. These educators admire how we have been able to focus on teaching Massachusetts's rigorous standards and while continuing stay fast to our mission of inspiring our students to participate in the life of our community. Tim Anderson our founder said that he and his wife Pam Cooney's vision in creating this school was to build a school centered on love. This past Monday at the Diversity Breakfast in Hanover celebrating Martin Luther King I saw an example of the manifestation of our founders' vision of a love centered school. Below is how I described it on Monday in an e-mail to other faculty and staff:

Today I went to see Mr. Small and his students at the interfaith diversity MLK breakfast in Hanover and I would like to let everyone know how grateful I was to be there to see and hear the work of Mr. Small and his students as they honored Martin Luther King Jr. June Fontaine spoke and introduced Rick and explained how last year at

a similar event she had thought of our students and how they could enrich Hanover King Breakfast. She along with others brought Rick and our students to this event.

There were clergy and cantors from at least five different churches and synagogues. This group led us in song and read Dr. King's words aloud.

Mr. Small delivered the central piece of the program as he spoke about courage, humility, love, Dr. King, St Paul, many others and his own encounters with anti-Semitism and his own direct experience with one of Dr. King's mentors. I learned a great deal and felt fortunate to have such learned and dedicated colleagues as June Fontaine and Rick Small.

After Mr. Small's talk eight of our Poetry Workshop students preformed original poems that they had written to honor Dr. King for this event. Their poetry and presentations were a wonderful testimony to the quality of our school and the value of SSCPS Projects and Workshops. The goal of our Projects and Workshops is to have a goal. These learning structures work best when the goal is constructive and adds value to community. Today at the MLK Breakfast all of those things were present but also present was the value of an adult modeling intellectual work and our students seeing the value of scholarship and how it can be a part of community life. The work of the adult also fulfilled a community need. They all represented our school so well and made me proud to be associated with our school.

As part of the talk, Mr. Small gave to honor Dr. King, he read parts of Dr. King's "Letter from a Birmingham Jail." Two sentences in that letter help me in thinking of the present moment in Haiti. King wrote, "We all caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly affects all indirectly."

Let us all continue to work together to be a community of effort and care.


