

Its official and we have it in writing; we have been renewed for a new five year charter term. One of the most significant differences between a charter public school and a traditional public school is that charter schools have to prove their effectiveness or they will be closed. Here is how the letter granting us another five year charter ended:

"The charter school initiative is a key component of education reform in Massachusetts, and your school has proved what a strong vision, high standards, and hard work can accomplish for the students of Massachusetts. I wish you great success as you continue to provide academic excellence and choice to the children of the Commonwealth.

We appreciate and agree with this expression of quality and want to share with all parts of our school our success as a team, for this is centrally the triumph of the students and their hard work but the adults (families and staff) can also take pride in this accomplishment as well.

One thing that has been a hallmark of our school is our constant focus on improvement and with this renewal we are beginning to start in earnest looking at our Accountability Plan for the 2011 -2015 charter period. Last spring as part of the renewal process a taskforce of a student, parents, teachers and administrators developed this Accountability Plan. The Accountability Plan is the road map or guide for our very bright future.

Our founding charter laid the ground work for a great school. The original charter envisioned a school where parents, students, and faculty all worked together to help develop a powerful and rich life. One way we try to achieve this goal is to communicate relentlessly. For the past several years we have had morning coffees where we can meet with families and gather feedback on how we are doing. In the past these, forums have been very important and have influence our thinking about how the school should evolve and develop. We very much hope that you can come.

Right after the earthquake in Haiti our students came to us and said that they wanted to do something. The message from the relief agencies were clear, what was needed most was cash. The students began and are continuing a "Coins for Haiti" collection. A teacher told me of sixth grade student who came in with a sack of coins the size of a honey dew melon. He told her that he had been collecting the bag since he was a baby and that it was going to be for a vacation but that now he wanted to do something more important with his money. That sentiment is being expressed from all parts of our community and we hope that all can come to this Saturday's Parents' Association Meeting where we will have a special presentation from parent Jacky Poteau about what is going on in Haiti and how we as a school could help. Over the past two weeks, the Board of Trustees and board chair, Jeff Seglin, and the school administrators have been working on plans to establish an on-going relationship with a school in Haiti as part of the "service" commitment in our mission. We connected with Jacky Poteau a parent who runs a nonprofit foundation called FATEM. We have worked with FATEM in the past donating clothes last year after the series of devastating hurricanes. FATEM is working closely with a professor at DePaul University in Chicago who has co-authored a book with our own Jeff Seglin. We are beginning this relationship with FATEM and DePaul to develop a long term plan that would connect us with a school and teachers in Haiti for years to come. Our goal is to have this partnership enrich the lives of the Haitian teachers and students as well as our own teachers and students. Now is a time to plan for a better future. Approval of Minutes

School Report - Ted Hirsch

- Prue is ill and unable to attend the meeting.
- Donovan Flauvell has been hired as a substitute to cover while Kendra is out on maternity leave. He will also be available to substitute throughout the building between now and when Kendra takes leave.
- A training for Level II & III teachers, under a grant secured with Holbrook schools, is scheduled. The program will focus on how best to communicate with students across the various classes /subjects, to create a collective unity of teaching.
- There will be a press conference conducted by the Mass Charter School Association at 11 am tomorrow at the State House. Parents are requested to attend, if possible.
- On Friday, Representative Bradley and his aide will visit the school
- An educator from the UK, Jonathan Crosley-Holland, will visit the school on Wednesday. Class Measures, the organization that
 conducted the school's charter renewal, recommended SSCPS as an example of an innovative, project-based school that he may like
 to observe.

General Discussion Topics

<u>Winter Concert</u>: Ted provided feedback regarding the Winter Concert. The students performed wonderfully, however the audience was noisy and not fully respectful of the performers. General discussion of how we could improve on this. Suggestions include hiring ushers, making a general announcement (as they do at movie theaters) regarding noise, cell phones and conversations. In general, the message of proper theatre etiquette needs to get out to attendees. It was also noted that the house lights were not functioning and not having dimmed lights – as is typical during a theatre performance – could have created an environment for noise. It was also suggested that the program include general timeframes for each level performance so that parties who need to leave early, for whatever reason, can do so at an appropriate break in the schedule. The Spring Concert will also be held at Notre Dame. While the facility offered ample parking, it was noted that the acoustics and lighting were poor.

New Lunch Program: Today was the first day of the new lunch program. Operationally, it ran pretty smoothly for the first day. There were comments regarding portion size; the full meal and the ¾ meal appeared to be very similar. At the high school level, there was a bit of a back up in the line. Overall, it seemed favorably received. As the pilot program continues, parents and students are encouraged to continue to provide their feedback.

School Report - Angie Pepin

- This week teachers are observing math classrooms in Scituate, where the McDougal math program is used. This is the new math program that SSPCS has selected for grades 7-12.
