SPOTLIGHT ON SSCPS FROM KENDRA WHITING WHITNEY

See You Later, Not Goodbye

When I was in college I had a roommate that always told the people she cared about, “when we part, I never say ‘goodbye’ because it is so final, I say ‘see you later’ because we will see each other again.” So whenever we would go off somewhere we would say, “see you later” and never “goodbye.” As I sit here on this sunny Saturday morning I am reminded of these words with a bittersweet feeling in my heart.

It is hard to believe that ten years have passed since I first walked into the red school building at 2 A Street in Hull for an interview as a Level III teacher. What a beautiful view of the ocean and children playing on the beach. This was an amazing place to have a school. I accepted the job as a 5th, 6th and 7th grade teacher that summer, and was so thrilled to begin this new chapter in my life. There were so many opportunities and experiences to have with such an amazing group of people. Working along side Lisa, Claire, Dan, Julia and Bill, I learned that just about anything was possible at South Shore Charter School (SSCS) if you were willing and able to make it happen. The freedom to teach and explore with the students was more than a teacher could dream of and seemed almost unheard of in the world of “education.” This school was truly different than what I had ever experienced or learned about in my undergrad education classes.

Two years later I welcomed the opportunity to work with 3rd and 4th grade students as part of the Level II team. There I joined another amazing group of educators that made the impossible look so easy. While I missed working with the older students and the team on Level III, this new group of students and colleagues was just right for me. My classroom moved a few miles across town to a little building on Samoset Avenue, where Level II would remain for the next few years. We were situated in what was once an old bank, but again right on the beach. At recess the students could play on the small playground, in the field or build sandcastles on the beach. This to me was more than just your typical school; it was a remarkable place where students, teachers and families were building bonds that would last forever.

Level II ended up moving back to the red school building on A Street two years later, and then made its final move to 100 Longwater Circle in Norwell in 2005. This was an exciting time in the history of the charter school. The three schools would now all be together on one campus and we would grow into the school that we are today. So many doors were opening to the students and faculty of what is now South Shore Charter Public School (SSCPS). Kindergartners working with High School students, classes collaborating on community projects together, concerts and performances where all grade levels could perform or attend, students teaching topics they had mastered to other students and their teachers, and a community that would grow into a place that not only challenged their students to achieve in academics, but also prepared them for the life skills needed to succeed in the world.

When I became the Level II Coordinator I knew that I had huge shoes to fill and accepted this challenge with eagerness and excitement. The families, students and teachers that I have had the pleasure of working with are an incredible gift to our school and community. From working with a dynamic group of teachers that collaborate together with such ease and determination, to teaching students that love to learn, to working with parents who would support your decisions because they trust that you will do what is right by their child, this truly is an amazing place. I feel so fortunate to have been a part of the evolution of the South Shore Charter Public School. However, my life has taken a new turn and has headed down the road of parenthood, a dream that has filled my life with more joy and happiness than I ever knew possible, and my journey with SSCPS will end here.

While I am sad to leave a place that I have called home for ten years, this is a decision that is best for my family. SSCPS will always have a special place in my heart, a place that will be hard to say goodbye to. So with that I say “see you later” not “goodbye,” because goodbye is so final and I know that I will see you again.

K-6 PRINCIPAL REPORT

I hope everyone got a chance to read Kendra Whitney's piece "See You Later, Not Goodbye." Kendra's piece gives a sense of the past ten years in our school and the love and cooperation that has put the community at the center of the school. While some of the names that she mentions refer back to a different time in our school and may not resonate for those who do not know them, the sense of teamwork and cooperation shine through Kendra's writing. That sense of teamwork and community is being felt through the entire school community and beyond with our work together on the Green School and the outcome of cooperation is far more valuable than any bus. While we wait to hear the official results I can say with all my heart we are winners because we have so many people coming together for an idea, that students can excel in academics, service and to me what is most significant, life, because they are affirmed as important.

Lately in the news there has been much attention placed to bullying. The state government is in the process of adopting a new law and supporting regulations that are designed to help children from unfair and damaging treatment from other children, bullying. Nantasket Nor'Easters –

March 31, 2010



The first practices of the brand new collaborative sailing team, the Nantasket Nor'Easters were held this week, despite the drenching rains. Sponsored by Sail Nantasket, a 501(c)3 non-profit foundation in Hull dedicated to encouraging the sport of sailing, the Nantasket Nor'Easters are a co-ed, high school sailing team, with students from Cohasset High School, Hull High School, and the South Shore Charter Public School in Norwell.

After several years of effort, the new sailing team was organized by several volunteers led by Mike Hebert of Marshfield, a sailing enthusiast and co-founder and current board member of Sail Nantasket.

The team is coached by Kevin Broome of Marshfield, who sailed for the Boston College High School Sailing Team, then went on to sail for and then coach at Providence College. Coach Broome has been coaching sailing and windsurfing since he was 15 years old and has worked extensively with high school and college students.

The team will sail out of Hull Yacht Club, sailing Club 420 sailboats. The 420 Class Dinghy is a monohull planing boat, designed for a crew of two. The name describes the overall length of the boat, which is exactly 4.2 meters long. The hull's seaworthiness, stability at speed, and modest sail area makes these the boats of choice for youth training.

The focus of the Nantasket Nor'Easters is on team racing, with six boats in the water per heat, three on three. There are also fleet racing events, with all participants on the water. Sailors use their boathandling skills, strategy, tactics and the course rules to outrace the other teams.

Regattas currently scheduled include the Sharon Invitational, Hingham/Notre Dame, Lincoln-Sudbury, Dover-Sherborn and Wellesley. Near the conclusion of this inaugural season, the team will sail in the Mass Bay League Fleet Racing Championship at the end of May.

The team and Coach Broome are looking forward to an exciting first season!

Parent Association Position Descriptions

Chair

- The Chair will have previously held a PA office or have attended a majority of the year's regular PA meetings.
- The Chair will plan the agenda and chair PA meetings.
- The Chair will have monthly meetings with the Executive Director to coordinate some of the PA activities and initiatives.
- The Chair will write a monthly report to the parents to be submitted to the Update (the official SSCPS communication vehicle) at the end of each month.
- The Chair will coordinate all PA committee activities.
- The Chair is the official spokesperson for the PA and as such will make reports to the SSCPS Board of Trustees.
- The Chair will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Chairperson.

Vice Chair (VC)

- The VC will assist the Chair with meeting organization and appointment of chairs.
- The VC will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming VCs.
- The VC will preside at meetings in the absence of the Chair or if the Chair decides to participate in discussion as a parent only.

Secretary

- The Secretary will take minutes of the meetings (to be approved at the subsequent meeting), post minutes, post meeting times, and reminders to the Executive Directors office for posting in the SSCPS Update.
- The Secretary will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Secretary.
- The Secretary will help the Chair write the monthly reports.

Treasurer

- The Treasurer will keep the books of the PA and make monthly reports to the PA.
- The Treasurer will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Treasurer.
- The Treasurer will assemble and Chair the PA Grant Task Force for the purpose of disbursing PA Funds.

Arts & Music Committee

Acts as an advocate for all of the Arts in the school curriculum: drama, literature, music and visual arts. Sets up visiting artist schedules, art-related field trips, and works to find grants to fund arts in the school.

Community Service Committee

Establishes and maintains ties between SSCPS and various community groups, with the purpose of guiding our students towards opportunities for fulfilling their community service requirements. Looks for grants to fund community service programs.

Fundraising & Events Committee

Organizes the parent fundraising activities and social events at the school. Each event may have a separate leader to orchestrate activities.

Health & Safety Committee

Guides the development of the health curriculum, safety policies and relations with various medical centers, adherence to related health laws, anti-smoking programs, drug prevention programs, medical policies and procedures.

Library Committee

The Library Committee participates in all aspects of maintaining the school's library including ongoing management of the library collection, fundraising to acquire new materials, writing grants, supporting students and teachers in their use of the library, and participating in the creation of an expanded library/media center. The goals for this school year are to update the current collection using a new computerized cataloging system and to partner with community libraries to introduce library skills to our students.

Volunteer Coordinator

The Volunteer Coordinator aids parents in the completion of volunteer requirements and assists Level Coordinators in filling their volunteer and chaperone needs.

Welcoming & Events Committee

Contacts families of new, incoming SSCPS students, to welcome them into the school community, and to provide them with information about the school and the Parents Association.

Grade Representatives

Communicates with the Level Coordinators and provides report to the PA at the monthly meetings.


