It takes a village ...

By the end of this week, postcards will be going out to parents and staff who have not yet contributed to the school's Annual Fund. As you know, the Annual Fund is our most important fundraiser. The monies raised from the Annual Fund and the Auction and Golf Tournament go to the school and help support what makes the school so unique – K-12 Spanish, art, music, workshops and projects, and state-of-the-art technology such as SmartBoards, LCD projectors, and AlphaSmart computers. In addition to these items for the school, your donations go towards five scholarships for our seniors, and \$5000 to the Parents Association for grants. To accomplish all of this, we need to raise a MINIMUM of \$60,000 this year. Four years ago, only 14% of our parents donated to the Annual Fund – last year, 51% contributed. Our goal for this year is to increase that percentage to 60%. One of the goals that the Board has for the new Executive Director is to help them with a Capital Campaign to complete the build out of the school. Major donors to institutions ask about the amount of money that they raise in their annual fund AND the participation rate. Please help us meet our goals of \$60,000 and 60%. We realize that the economy has still not recovered so we are asking families to donate what they can and remember that we really need to get that participation rate needs to get to 60% or higher.

LUNCH PROGRAM

School Lunch Pilot Program Update:

The students and faculty have had the opportunity to sample lunches from two vendors this past winter. Beginning May 10th the school will sample another lunch vendor on a temporary basis. Included in the April 28th update will be the new lunch menu for the period of May 10-June 18^{th.} The purpose of these pilot lunch programs is to allow our students the opportunity to taste different lunch items and to allow the school to work with other vendors around the serving of school lunches based on our current lunch schedules and the fact that we do not have a cafeteria. The administration is committed to providing healthier lunch choices at an affordable cost to our families. Our goal is to implement a new lunch program beginning next academic year.

7-12 PRINCIPAL REPORT

Over the past two weeks we have had the opportunity to host the four candidates who would like to become our next Executive Director. The experience has been a gratifying and educational one. Candidates had the opportunity to meet with faculty, administrators, parents, students, and members of our Board of Trustees. Additionally, the candidates toured our building, visited classes, and saw Projects and Workshops in action with the help of student guides. Our visitors were impressed by both the work that they observed and the uniqueness of our model. It is exciting to be part of a school that so many dedicated educators would like the chance to lead.

Speaking about our accomplishments with the candidates has helped remind me of how extraordinary the work our students and teachers do each day is. Our school is committed to not only prepare students academically, but to provide them with the life skills they need as they move on to college and beyond. An important component of that work is helping our students foster public speaking skills and confidence when speaking with adults. Our student tour guides and those that participated in the student focus groups asked questions of the candidates with poise. They were able to describe what they were looking for in a new Executive Director and how they would like that person to support their learning. The candidates commented on how articulate our students are and how well they know their school.

These skills go far beyond the walls of our school. The segment below, written by a parent, describes the recent success of our students in the Speaking American Contest.

"Our mission is to inspire every student in academics, service and life. We all understand that we are here for academics, and service grabs the headlines, but what about life. The teaching of life skills at SSCPS is a vital part of who we are. Our children learn to lead, learn to follow, learn to work in groups and learn to speak in public. The public speaking part was on display this weekend at the Boston Public Library as four of our third and fourth graders competed in the Speaking American Contest. Portia Chambers, Julia Griffin, Jordan Lussier and Michael Maniscalco all gave one minute speeches in front of a room full of competitors and their families. All our kids spoke with passion, confidence, energy and enthusiasm. Their efforts were recognized as Jordan Lussier placed first in the 4th grade, Michael Maniscalco placed second in the fourth grade and Portia Chambers received an honorable mention in the third grade competition. To stand in front of a room full of strangers and speak words that you wrote is a daunting task. Our children begin learning this important life skill in kindergarten where they are asked to present to their peers on their own work. It may be a rock collection or a poster of colors and shapes but the content is outweighed by the experience of standing and speaking in front of people. As we enter another season of exhibitions of mastery it is important that we remember our mission and the life skills we teach."

In our search for a new executive director we know that it is important that representatives from all segments of our community are involved in the process of choosing our next Executive Director. Our faculty has prepared our students well for this challenge and we will be sure to let the views and impressions of our students be known to the Board of Trustees as they work to choose the next executive director and to lead our school into its next phase. --Angie Pepin apepin@sscps.org

Parent Association Position Descriptions

Chair

- The Chair will have previously held a PA office or have attended a majority of the year's regular PA meetings.
- The Chair will plan the agenda and chair PA meetings.
- The Chair will have monthly meetings with the Executive Director to coordinate some of the PA activities and initiatives
- The Chair will write a monthly report to the parents to be submitted to the Update (the official SSCPS communication vehicle) at the end of each month.
- The Chair will coordinate all PA committee activities.
- The Chair is the official spokesperson for the PA and as such will make reports to the SSCPS Board of Trustees.
- The Chair will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Chairperson.

Vice Chair (VC)

- The VC will assist the Chair with meeting organization and appointment of chairs.
- The VC will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming VCs.
- The VC will preside at meetings in the absence of the Chair or if the Chair decides to participate in discussion as a parent only.

Secretary

- The Secretary will take minutes of the meetings (to be approved at the subsequent meeting), post minutes, post meeting times, and reminders to the Executive Directors office for posting in the SSCPS Update.
- The Secretary will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Secretary.
- The Secretary will help the Chair write the monthly reports.

Treasurer

- The Treasurer will keep the books of the PA and make monthly reports to the PA.
- The Treasurer will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Treasurer.
- The Treasurer will assemble and Chair the PA Grant Task Force for the purpose of disbursing PA Funds.

Arts & Music Committee

Acts as an advocate for all of the Arts in the school curriculum: drama, literature, music and visual arts. Sets up visiting artist schedules, art-related field trips, and works to find grants to fund arts in the school.

Community Service Committee

Establishes and maintains ties between SSCPS and various community groups, with the purpose of guiding our students towards opportunities for fulfilling their community service requirements. Looks for grants to fund community service programs.

Fundraising & Events Committee

Organizes the parent fundraising activities and social events at the school. Each event may have a separate leader to orchestrate activities.

Health & Safety Committee

Guides the development of the health curriculum, safety policies and relations with various medical centers,

adherence to related health laws, anti-smoking programs, drug prevention programs, medical policies and procedures. Library Committee

The Library Committee participates in all aspects of maintaining the school's library including ongoing management of the library collection, fundraising to acquire new materials, writing grants, supporting students and teachers in their use of the library, and participating in the creation of an expanded library/media center. The goals for this school year are to update the current collection using a new computerized cataloging system and to partner with community libraries to introduce library skills to our students.

Volunteer Coordinator

The Volunteer Coordinator aids parents in the completion of volunteer requirements and assists Level Coordinators in filling their volunteer and chaperone needs.

Welcoming & Events Committee
