Well **we** did it and it feels **good!** We have accomplished an important task; we have been named America's Greenest School. There are so many people to thank and to acknowledge and the list begins with the students in Sarah Roberts and Bill Tramontana's Pod. They gave us all a vision of believing, and working, and reaching out. A while back I said to them that I would give them an ice cream party when the contest was over if we did not win. I was trying to soften the blow of what I saw as disappointment to come. I could not allow myself the hope that the eventual outcome was our being named America's Greenest School. The students responded to the idea of an ice cream party that it should not be for them alone, but for the whole of Level II. The student response, which was in the form of letters, taught me many things. They taught me the danger of not including others in this show of appreciation, that to limit thanks would hurt other people's feeling and that hurt feelings could weaken our overarching goal of being green. They wrote that everyone should be thanked because everyone did their part.

I tried to look at this contest, like other educational endeavors, where it is the internal reward that is the goal. We talked about how we wanted more votes everyday than the day before and we tried not to compare our votes to others. We talked about the importance of the honor system and following the rules, and most of all we talked about how to reach out and be a team. What I liked the most about the whole thing was how Bill and Sarah include everyone and made us all feel a part of this contest.

Now that we have won I know we will not be complacent or self satisfied. I also hope that we are proud and happy and ready to become even greener. It is so nice to realize that as a school we have survived and build on our survival. Thanks to everyone and the strength we found in each other over these past years.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the March meeting were approved.

- Ballots for next year's PA Board are in preparation. If you are interested in serving, please contact Deidre Lamoureux. This year, voting will take place online. Election results will be announced in May.

School Report - Prue Goodale

Prue announced that the 4 candidates for the Executive Director position will be visiting the school and parents are encouraged to meet them during the hours announced in the Update. Parents unable to make these sessions are also welcome to attend the BOT meeting on April 17th, when the candidates will be interviewed by the BOT.

Prue thanked everyone for their participation in America's Greenest School competition and noted that the event was a success in bringing the entire school community together. Prue also announced that June and Cassandra are invited speakers to a Kindergarten program where they will be speaking on the Core Knowledge curriculum.

School Report - Angie Pepin

The 7-12 students really enjoyed working with the younger students in rallying the vote for the greenest school award and expressed interest in doing more together with the elementary grades.

MCAS testing is taking place in Level IV next week. The long composition test was held last week. Grade reports for students in grades 7-11 will be issued next Friday. Seniors will begin their senior projects after April vacation week.

Angie will be heading up the newly formed task force on bullying. The task force will be comprised of parents, students and faculty. Parent volunteers presently include Deidre Lamoureux and Beth Toma. A parent from School Council will also join the team.

The task force's main goal will be to create a bully prevention and intervention plan (required under the new law). They will also be exploring age-appropriate instruction for students and professional development programs for staff. The first meeting is scheduled for Monday, April 12th. This is an open meeting and anyone who wishes to attend may do so.

Prue announced that Angie Pepin has been appointed on a permanent basis to the position of Principal for grades 7-12. The Level IV Coordinator position is open and the job posting will be issued on Monday.

School Report - Ted Hirsch

Ted reported on a Restorative Practices/Restorative Justice workshop he attended last week. From this workshop, Ted concluded that this program is effective in working out what happened, who was harmed and how to repair the harm; however, it's not a solution for addressing bullying. A task force has been formed to address bullying. In conjunction with that, the School Council will be tasked with reviewing the school's code of discipline. It was suggested that the revised policies be reported at future PA meeting.

Beth Toma presented a sample of some of the new books that the library has recently purchased. All new books are designated as such by a special sticker on the spine. Old Business / New Business

Heritage Day: Heritage Day is scheduled for May 6th and will be celebrated throughout the school. The event is being coordinated by Linita Shin and Dee Delaney. Each level will organize its own program. The heritage profile of students at SSCPS encompasses over 60 nationalities. Parents are encouraged to assist students in preparing native costumes and helping with decorations for the schools. An international café will be set up with a selection of foods from different cultures.

Pilot Lunch Programs: Parent Yeemay Miller, a professional nutritionist, provided comments on the feedback reported at last month's PA meeting. She noted that we all have a common goal of feeding our children healthy foods, and it's important for all of us to get more fruits and vegetables into our diets. Healthy food is often more expensive.

With regard to food waste, she reported that research has shown that children need repeated exposure to new foods before adopting them. Yeemay noted that DoorKnock dinners was and remains very receptive to our feedback and she hopes that parents will continue to consider their offerings when making the final selection for a food service vendor for next year. Yeemay also offered a nutrition tip: pumpkin seeds, salmon, flax seed and other foods rich in omega-3 are all good for brain development.

School landscaping services: Prue informed us that the landscaping service will be using organic products in servicing the school. She also noted that exterior benches have been removed due to splintering of the wood. New ones are needed and if anyone can help in constructing them, their services would be very welcome.
