### Inspiring every student in academics, service, and life

Over the past month, there have been so many examples of SSCPS fulfilling its mission. In addition to their daily assignments and assessments, students have taken the English Language Arts MCAS and now they are preparing for the science and math MCAS tests which will take place over the next three weeks. Our seniors took their final exams before the April vacation and they are now doing their senior internship. Needless to say, teachers and staff have been focusing upon academics to ensure each student's success and achievement. One of the state's expectations for charter schools is that they disseminate their practices to other public schools. Yesterday, Ted Hirsch, June Fontaine, and Kassandra Sullivan were presenters at the state-wide kindergarten conference on the topic, "Teaching Kids to Read: A Classroom Teachers Perspective."

Of course, amidst all of the academic studies, our students and staff have been involved in numerous service projects to benefit the school and the larger community. The first example which comes to mind is our entry in the America's Greenest School competition. Ashley Thurmon, the representative for the organization, commented to me that what impressed IC Bus and others sponsoring the competition the most about SSCPS was the fact that our green initiatives were throughout the school and that students were promoting going green beyond the walls of our school as well. Not only was our video entry well done, viewers learned about the Veggie Van, the recycling throughout the school, and students' efforts to conserve both at school and at home.

Since the announced was made, we have received many congratulatory emails. One of them was from Tim Anderson and Pam Cooney, founders of the school. They commented that they were so pleased that their vision of a school that embraced service learning and respect for the environment was still major components of our mission. Last Tuesday, the same day that we learned we won the competition, students from the Veggie Van project and the Level IV Teracycle Project were recognized at EMD/Serono's Earth Day event. Our Veggie Van was on display and students answered questions from employees at Serono about the van and how they filtrated the oil from Serono's kitchen so that it could be used in our van. Last Friday, high school students involved in the Veggie Van project were honored at the State House and received a Secretary's Award. This is the second year in a row that our high school students have been recipients of this award.

For the past five years, SSCPS has been the recipient of a Service Learning grant. One of the requirements of the grant is for the school to present at the statewide conference. Yesterday, Sarah Roberts, Bill Tramontana, and the students in her Waste Watchers project presented at Holy Cross. Again, SSCPS is meeting its charter requirements – dissemination of successful practices to others!

Tim Anderson and Pam Cooney also expected students at SSCPS to give back to their communities and to help those in need. This weekend a number of our students participated in the Walk for Hunger and this Friday night at 7:00 p.m. there will be a Poetry Slam and Concert at SSCPS. Students in Mr. Small's high school Poetry Workshop will read their poems and students in Andre Kim's Music Workshop will perform. Tickets are \$5 and all ages – including adults --- are welcome. All of the money will go to the Haiti Relief Fund.

We plan to spotlight some of the group and individual service projects at the next Board of Trustees meeting on May 20<sup>th</sup>. Service learning is alive and well at SSCPS.



### 7-12 PRINCIPAL REPORT

South Shore Charter Public School is humming with excitement as we all celebrate winning the America's Greenest School contest. It is wonderful to see the efforts of Sarah's Project, and the school at large, be recognized so publicly. This moment provides us with yet another opportunity to spread the word about the excellent work that our students and faculty do each day.

While we celebrate this accomplishment I would like to draw attention to a high school student who is also working to improve the environment. Matthew McAteer, an SSCPS Junior, was selected to participate in the Millennium Youth Camp in Helsinki Finland, after being encouraged to apply by his science teacher, Rachel Oser. This highly competitive program will give Matt the opportunity to work with top scientists, government officials, corporate leaders, and other students from all over the world. The themes of the camp include environmental science and technology (climate change, renewable natural resources, renewable energy, water conservation), information and communications technology, digitalization, and applied mathematics. The program provides students with travel arrangements, accommodations, dining, and all of the educational opportunities completely free of charge.

From the 995 students that applied for the program 100 were identified as finalists and from those 30 were chosen to participate on the basis of the strength of their applications. Of those 30 students only two are from North America. Matt's achievement is truly a significant one.

Currently, Matt is busy researching to prepare for his time in Finland. His project, part of the larger Climate Change group, is focused on creating a demonstration model of wetlands reclamation for South Shore communities. To do this work Matt has partnered with the New England Wildlife Center where he has volunteered for the past five years. He will likely target a one acre habitat that is suitable to wetland animal species. While in Finland Matt will have the opportunity to discuss his research with the experts there as well as with the other students in the program. The camp takes place between June 6<sup>th</sup> and June 13<sup>th</sup>. We are all looking forward to Matt sharing his experience with the SSCPS community on his return.
