K-6 PRINCIPAL REPORT

What a week it was... On Wednesday May 5th we saw just how great our new bus will be; right in front of the school there was big beautiful yellow school bus with a few differences. It had two big black boxes underneath and big electrical plug on the side. When our bus, which is to be built just for us, arrives in September it will be the only electric hybrid school bus in Massachusetts. Not only will we receive a bus in the fall but IC Bus delivered to us last Wednesday three big checks, just like you see on the news. We have a new big banner on the front of the school that proudly proclaims that we are America's Greenest School (Thanks Nancy). Prue, Sarah, four students and I gave short talks expressing thanks and gratitude for all of the folks who over the fifteen years of the school made this happen. We all spoke not just of the satisfaction in our recognition but a commitment to become even greener in the future. We had a rock concert under a tent and everybody had a wonderful time. The concert had dancing, hand waving, and good spirited rock and rollers. The band was very patient and kind to a very multi-aged audience, plus I have been told by those who know – they could play.

Now for many schools that would be enough, but not here at SSCPS. Last Wednesday morning before the press conference and the presentation of the Greenest School awards, we had our first playgroup/screening for next year's kindergarteners. We spent two hours with the incoming kindergarteners and got to meet the SSCPS class of 2023. The future students played and listen to stories and we got to know them and they got to know the school. It was a special treat for me because I was able to spend significant time on the floor playing with blocks and I even got to read the children a book (non-fiction). It was a team of nine professionals who worked together to get to know these students so that we can plan and be ready for next year. Again today, we had another get together with the second group of next year's students and that was equally fun. Kindergarten screening and playgroup is just one example of something new that we are doing to make us better.

Now for many schools that would be enough, but not here at SSCPS. On Thursday we had Heritage Day and what a blast that was. The day began with a parade of Level II students who showed the flags of our Heritage through out the whole building. Then on Level I all of the students had the opportunity to dance the meringue from the Dominican Republic. After Karina Nelson's students gave spirited performances the Level I students and faculty were treated to Nora Broderick's compelling re-telling of the Three Pigs in Irish. Now none of us understood a word but we were all enraptured, children and adults alike by the words that accompanied an old Disney Cartoon because of the passion and range of Nora's voice. Her tone and timbre was all the accompaniment the familiar story needed to be meaningful. I learned more about Nora and language and communication. Later I saw more great performances on Level two of more meringue from the Dominican Republic and skits about the world. I got a tour through the six populated continents in the high

school rooms with memorable trips to Africa and Asia. A little later I ate my way through the world with stops on Level III, IV and the High School. Now it is often said that food equals culture and culture equals love. There was love and a celebration of heritage throughout the whole school. The out pouring of energy and effort and the message that we all belong together in our school was everywhere.

Heritage Day was a wonderful outcome of Project Based, Service Learning as the students in the Caribbean Diversity Workshop along with their teachers Linita Shih and Alba Guzman transformed the whole school. They day closed with dancers from Level I and II doing the meringue, students from the High School singing America the Beautiful and recognition from Linita for the 14 parents who helped out in the high school and the dozens of parents who help out with the younger students. The efforts of the parents typified the work of so many over the years in sharing with our staff and students their love of personal and cultural history. Linita thanked them all as they taught us such things a genealogy, calligraphy and the world. All we could say was wow. Heritage Day is just one more example of something new that we are doing to make us better.

Now for many schools that would be enough, but not here at SSCPS. On Friday night about hundred spectators and performers gathered in a Poetry Slam and Rock Concert for Haiti. This dual Workshop celebration was a benefit for Haiti and over \$300 dollars was raised for Hope for Haiti an orphanage being established by the Desgrottes family down in Haiti. The eight poets and twenty musicians amazed the audience with there passion and drive. Rick Small's and Andre Kim's students gave us another reason to celebrate and it got me thinking of math. We have over thirty Projects and Workshops and each is required to have at least two celebrations of their work every year. No that is about one every three days and last week was exceptional but not that unusual for us here at SSCPS, where we believe that students can make this a better world, this and every day. The Poetry Slam and Rock Concert is just one more example of something new that we are doing to make us better.
