## K-6 Principal Report

One of the most difficult parts of being a fully engaged person is to be present for the moment and at the same time to plan for the future. It is important to try to reach a balance where you are getting the most out of each experience and still are able to structure your time so there are great moments to follow. It is no different for a school. A school needs to plan for the future, while at the same time being present for the moment. Right now we are focused on finishing the year with clarity, celebrating our accomplishments and putting the students in positions to demonstrate their mastery in Science Fairs, Spring Concerts, overnight trips to conferences, performances and culminating Project celebrations. We are also planning for next year, interviewing candidates and looking to the future. We are trying to attain that balance of being present for the moments and also looking ahead and planning for next year.

For the past several months folks have been asking me how we plan to staff Level II next year when we will have approximately 96 students. We have been telling parents that because of the number of students on Level II next year we would hire a fifth teacher. When asked how we would use that fifth teacher, I have equivocated and said we are not sure yet, we are still talking about how best to manage the situation. The Level II Team and the Administrative Team have come up with what seems to be an excellent plan for next year. Over the next ten days we will be interviewing candidates for the Level II position. Next year there will be eight full-time staff working solely with Level II students: six teachers and two aides or assistant teachers. In addition, all students will continue to have art, music, Spanish and physical education and, as in previous years, eligible students will receive learning services and Title I support.

This year Level II has had 91 students and it is a testament to the students and the teachers just how well this group has worked together. We are excited about what will happen next year. Our overarching goal in how we will structure the Level II staff is to give the students the education they need in an orderly and focused setting. Our plan is to have four classrooms next year, just like this year, and to have those four classrooms set up in two teams of two. Each team of two classrooms will have one classroom with a pair of teachers who will co-teach a single group, and a single-teacher classroom. The co-taught pod will have slightly more children, 26 as compared to 22 or 23 in the single teacher classroom. The teams will consist of Sarah Roberts co-teaching with Liz Martello, paired with Donavan Fauvelle, and Kristen Swanson co-teaching with the new hire, paired with Krista Cafourek. The new teacher will also run a Project, so next year on Level II there will be five Projects. We are looking forward to meeting the new candidates and developing a clear vision for how we can be even better next year.

On May $13^{\text {th }}$ we had a group of very distinguished visitors who wanted to see what we were doing here at SSCPS. The group included Tom Fortmann from the state Board of Education, Ed Moscovitz, a director and co-founder of The Bay Sate Reading Institute, and Kelly Ally, the Bay State Institute’s trainer of reading coaches. Also visiting us were Lesley Maxwell and Pamela Hook, the coordinators of MGH’s cross-training
graduate program in Speech, Language and Reading. The visitors were especially excited by our oral language instruction. When the group was meeting with the Level I teachers at lunch, Lesley Maxwell said that she just wanted to take the teaching she had seen that day and bottle it. Now these folks will spread the word of our work and in fact Lesley Maxwell plans to speak about what she saw when she presents this summer at the National Reading Institute in Anaheim, California.

This kind of spreading of the word is an important part of the National Charter School movement and, in fact, dissemination is one of the requirements of all Massachusetts Charter Schools. Some of our brother and sister schools in Boston are developing alternative teacher training programs to help improve the success of American education, and while planning for next year we have taken a step toward developing our own training program. We will have a new teaching structure on Level I. Karen Yelin will be working $60 \%$ next year. Karen will be in charge of all lesson planning and student evaluation and will be leading the core academic instruction. Working alongside Karen will be a newly certified teacher. This teacher will be able to train with Karen and the other Level I teachers to learn some of that magic that Lesley Maxwell wants to bottle. This new teacher will then spread the learning she has gained working with us to other schools and help spread our good work.
