## Annual Fund Reminder

Next week, Kathy Arthur Tyler from our Foundation, Kristine Shipps, and I will be attending a full-day conference on Green School Solutions for Massachusetts. We will be using what we have learned from the Green School Audit that will be presented tomorrow evening at the Board of Trustees meeting along with information from the conference to write for grants to help our school go green. One of my goals for this year was to raise the Annual participation rates for all groups. Yesterday, the faculty and staff surprised me with a fabulous send-off party. Pam Algera had asked my husband Geoff what I would like and he told her that rather than a gift (although they did give me a beautiful SSCPS rocker), I would like to have everyone contribute to the Annual Fund. THEY DID IT! We have $100 \%$ participation from our faculty and staff - a first. Last year, the participation rate of our families reached a new high $51 \%$. Right now, we are at about $41 \%$. In our goals for the year, we set a goal of $60 \%$ participation for our parents. As a final request as your Executive Director, please give to our Annual Fund. Our "books" close on June $30^{\text {th }}$ so it is not too late. The amount that you can give us is not important - just donate. It will make a huge difference in our ability to raise funds for the school and a future capital building campaign if we can show STRONG participation rates from all groups.

## Annual SSCPS Satisfaction Survey

Everyone uses surveys to get important information from their constituents - voters, customers, clients, employees, parents, students, etc. One of the major ways that the Charter School Office of the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education evaluates a charter school's performance is the results from the annual satisfaction survey. Each year at this time, we ask four groups to give us feedback on how we are doing as a school in educating our students, how well we communicate to everyone, and the effectiveness of our working relationships with faculty, parents, and members of the Board of Trustees. The four groups surveyed are faculty/staff, parents, students, and the Board of Trustees. The deadline to complete the survey is Monday, June 28th. It is EXTREMELY IMPORTANT that we have large percentages of each group completing the survey. The survey in on-line and it does not require a lot of time to complete. Ideally, we would like to $100 \%$ participation from ALL four groups. The information from the survey is reported to the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education as part of our Annual Report and our Renewal Documents.
