



A new school year and renewing our commitment to SSCPS

Welcome returning and new families. From all accounts, this has been one of the smoothest openings ever for SSCPS. For the first few days of school to go smoothly, it takes the cooperation and collaboration of our families, students, and staff. The first three days have been a great example of everyone working together to ensure a positive start to the school year and bring out the best in our students. For those who have been with the school for some time now, you have heard us on numerous occasions reference the "three legged stool" that was the basis of school's founding group's philosophy of schooling and the key to student success. For SSCPS to succeed in realizing its new mission, "inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life," we definitely will need the legged stool of students, staff and families working in concert!

This July, the Leadership Team was extremely busy finishing up the renewal documents that we were required to submit by July 31st to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Every five years, DESE requires charter schools to apply for another five year extension of their charter. In addition to these documents that included a new Accountability Plan for 2011-2016 and a revised mission statement, an important part of the renewal process is a four-day site visit by a team of educators. We have learned that the site visit will be the week of October 19th. In future Updates, I will share with you more information about the site visit and we will be asking parents/guardians from all Levels to be part of a focus group that will meet with the site visit team to answer their questions about our school and the education that your sons and daughters receive here. Over the next few weeks, our entire staff will be getting ready to be the best hosts ever and to provide the team with an accurate picture of SSCPS and help them to understand why we believe that this is such a special and unique school.

Family involvement- a call for volunteering

Yesterday, I sent out an email to everyone about **volunteering at SSCPS.** When families apply to SSCPS for their child to be admitted, they also agree to commit to doing some volunteer work for the school. Last year, we had a significant increase in the number of individuals volunteering and in the number of volunteer hours. Sixty percent (60%) of the families volunteered! Our goal is to increase that percentage this year. To achieve this goal, the first piece of information that we need from everyone is the survey form that we attached to the email. If you did not get the email with the attachments, please go to our website, <u>www.sscps.org</u> and you can find them on our main page. You can also pick up the information at the front desk. We would like to have the completed **volunteer form and signed confidentiality agreement returned to us by Friday, September 11.** This will give us time to be able to determine the interest areas and volunteer availability and then do the best we can to match up our needs with the skills of our family volunteers!

Parents needed to serve on the School Council and Education Committee.

As we say over and over again, the strength of this school is the wonderful relationship between our families and staff members. One way that parents and guardians can help our school move forward is to volunteer to serve on either the School Council or the Education Committee. We need at least one parent representative for K-6 and one for 7-12 on both of these important committees. However, we would prefer to have at least one representative per Level. Again this year, the School Council will meet on the second Thursday of the month and the Education Committee will meet on the day of the Board of Trustees meeting (usually the third Thursday of the month). For September, however, the meeting dates are later since there are five Thursdays in the month. The first Council meeting of the year will be Thursday, September 17th and the first Education Committee will meet be Thursday, September 23rd. The meetings begin at 3:30 p.m. and all parents are invited to attend.

First Parents Association meeting

The first Parent Association meeting of the year is next **Tuesday, September 8th at 7:00 p.m.** Last year we had a great turn-out for the kick-off meeting of the year and we hope that this year we will have an even better turn-out. We do not know what we would do without our active Parents Association. Although so much is accomplished at each PA meeting and it is a great opportunity to hear from school administrators about goals, academic initiatives, and student activities, the first meeting is very special.

Family Picnic

Wednesday, September 9th, from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., is the PA's wonderful Family Picnic. This is great opportunity for parents and their children to meet other families and learn more about SSCPS in an informal setting. The picnic is the culmination of a number of special summer events organized and run by members of the PA to provide families from our thirty communities with opportunities to socialize and get to know one another better. Parents organized the June Brockton Rox baseball outing and they organized and "staffed" the morning play group for Level I students and their families that ran every Thursday in July and August. Because so many parents were involved in organizing and running these events, I am not going to name them all because I know that I will most likely overlook someone. Suffice it to say, we don't know what we would do without the PA and the committed parents who volunteer day in and day out to help our students and build community at SSCPS!

Finally, we have some changes planned for the Update this year. As most of you know, like so many schools across the Commonwealth, we had to make some reductions in our budget for this year due to the recession. One of those changes was the decision to have a part-time Executive Director. I am thrilled to return for another year and I know that we will be able to make all of the budget changes work because we have such great administrators, teachers, and support staff. One change that we will be making is my Update reports to you. I will be writing an Update every other week. There will always be a report from one of our two principals in every weekly Update. A new feature that we will be adding is "**Spotlight on SSCPS.**" Beginning this week, there will be a feature story written by one of our staff members. A sample of some of the features will be community service, nutrition, wellness, information about specific workshops and projects, family literacy, the school library, learning services, physical education, and more. Teachers will be the authors of the Spotlight column and I know that you will look forward to the column each week.

Working together, we will make the 2009-2010 school year at SSCPS one for the record books!

K-6 PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

We are in the middle of the first week of school and there are already established routines. I get a feeling from being in the school this week that this will be a wonderful year of learning and purpose. The kindergarteners are settled in and sitting and working and listening with great poise. The early kindergarten dismissal at noon has gone well. We get a chance to speak with every adult as they pick up the kindergarteners and the children are coming in with joy when we see them again in the morning. At 3:00 the pick-up line is moving better than it ever has in the first week of school and we seem ready for the year.

Every other week in the Update I will write a notice in the Update. The purpose of these paragraphs is to let you know a little bit about what I am thinking about and what is going on here at school. This week town meetings have been held, recess schedules have been refined, students have composed classroom and level rules, classes have begun, and students have made new friends. An exciting change that I have seen is just how clean our students are keeping the school. In this year's school improvement plan, we have new focus on the cleanliness of our school. To help us out please put name tags or label your students' clothes. It is saddening to see the unclaimed clothes in the lost and found. We will work hard to help the students keep track of their clothes but it would help us tremendously if you would label their outer clothes, which on warm fall days are so easy to leave behind.

In writing this update my goal is to be transparent and clear. I also want you to know I want feedback on how we are doing as a school; I want you to tell me: in person, by phone or e-mail, <u>thirsch@sscps.org</u> what is going on for your student at this school.

School has begun and it feels like we have started a rich and full year of study. I hope that every day we have purpose and focus. We are a community that believes in children, in children's learning, in children's happiness, and children's abilities to make this world better. Welcome and help make us better.

7-12 PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I want to use this opportunity to welcome everyone back to South Shore Charter for the 2009 - 2010 school year and welcome students and families who are new to our school community. For the month of July a great deal of time and energy was spent writing our Annual Report and completing our charter renewal application. The work required us to complete two major documents. A large part of the work asked that we take time to describe the history of the school, explain the current school program, and project ahead to the direction our school will take in the next five years. Though this was time consuming and often difficult work, the benefits of reflecting on past and current practices and planning ahead will pay huge dividends. One immediate benefit to all of us involved in this work was the realization that our school is a special place, that it always has been and that it will continue to be a school focused on inspiring students to excel in academics, service, and life. A goal for all of us involved in the writing of these two documents is to share the work with you throughout the school year.

As I write this piece for the Update, we are in day three of the new school year. Thus far we are off to a great start. Last week, incoming ninth graders and students new to the high school took part in our second Summer Institute. The goal of the institute is to prepare students for the high school program, engage them in team building activities, and take diagnostic tests to help us better understand the learning needs of each student. From all accounts, the three day Institute was a success.

While the Summer Institute was up and running, Faculty returned for professional development. A variety of opportunities were available for them. One required workshop was designed to create consistency in the way SSCPS teachers plan and deliver lessons. It is expected that this consistency in practice will benefit our students as they move from one class to the next and one grade to the next.

A change all of us in Levels IV and the High School are measuring is the effectiveness of our new schedule. This year we established time in the school day on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday afternoons for students to participate in quarter courses including advisories, Directed Study, Town Meetings, Physical Education, and technology offerings. It is expected that building time into our schedule to offer instruction and academic support will help students do the work asked of them, and one critical area all of us will be focusing on is the work before us. This summer I was fortunate to attend an Institute at Harvard University titled Redesigning High Schools for Improved Instruction. A constant mantra echoing throughout the week of classes was "Task Predicts Performance." This year we will be looking at what we teach, how we teach, and are students learning. At the heart of our work will be an examination of the tasks we ask of students.

Finally, one goal in our School Improvement Plan is to develop structures to create a clean school. In conversations with students beginning next week, we will develop strategies to keep our school clean.

I hope everyone is excited as me to begin a new school year. Though the tasks before us are difficult, I am convinced that together we can accomplish anything. Welcome back and have a great year.
