## 7-12 PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

## Program Changes

Last year administrators, teachers, students, and parents reviewed our math program and decided to change the grade 7 - 12 program. The school continues to use the Singapore Math program for grades K - 6 but a decision was reached to change the $7-12$ program and use a textbook series from McDougal Littell beginning this September. During the 2008-2009 school year, we worked on the transition of our math program by supplementing Singapore materials with McDougal Littell materials. Some credit for our much improved MCAS math scores from the 2009 testing should be credited to this transition.

With the new $7-12$ math program in place, $7^{\text {th }}$ graders are now taking Pre Algebra and $8^{\text {th }}$ graders are taking Algebra. These Level IV students will go on to take Algebra II in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, Geometry in $10^{\text {th }}$ grade, Pre Calculus in $11^{\text {th }}$ grade, and Calculus in $12^{\text {th }}$ grade. This shift of our math program will add rigor and give our students an advantage in the college application process. Currently, there are seven students in Calculus who are considering taking the Advanced Placement exam in May.

We are also changing our high school Spanish program. This year the high school offerings are titled Spanish I, Spanish II, Spanish III, and Spanish IV. The Spanish teachers are currently working to map our high school Spanish curriculum with the goal of having students who have been with us for four years of high school Spanish speaking, reading, and writing in the target language. As I write this piece for the Update, we are having conversations about adding an Advanced Placement Spanish course to the high school program of studies.

In the coming months we will be having conversations in the high school about what programs we should offer next year and in the future. We will continue to examine our math and Spanish programs and look at our English, history, and science programs. I will use the Update and other venues to keep the community informed on these discussions. Please continue to share with me your thoughts on these program changes and any other school-related matter.
