## 7-12 PRINCIPAL's REPORT

To the Members of the SSCPS Community:
It is with a heavy heart that I write this Update piece and inform you that I am resigning my position as Grades $7-12$ Principal effective December $1^{\text {st }}$. This was not an easy decision, and I deliberated for months before making it.

I first came to SSCPS with the intention of relocating to the eastern part of the state. For both personal and financial reasons, my wife and I did not move the family east, and for the past year I have come east to work while my family stayed in western Massachusetts. This separation has been very difficult for me and for my family. My wife and two sons, ages 15 and 12, need me home, and I need to be with them.

There is never a good time in the year for a school administrator to leave. Typically, this is done in the summer. However, the cycle of the work of charter schools is different than that of traditional public schools and summer was not an option. This July the leadership team wrote and submitted two major documents to the Department of Education, our Annual Report and our Application for Renewal. Both documents were due August $1^{\text {st }}$, so leaving in July was not a viable option. August was spent preparing for the new school year and September was spent ensuring a smooth opening to the year, so leaving in August and September did not make sense. Beginning this summer, Prue and I have been in discussion on an exit strategy and we agreed that December $1^{\text {st }}$ would be best.

There is so much I will miss about South Shore Charter that I will not even attempt to list all the people and things that have left an impression on me for fear of leaving something out. I have learned a great deal in the past year and the code that guides me in life has changed as a result. This code, always subject to change, now goes as follows: Be nice. Work hard. Do the right thing. I will take this code with me along with the memories of this community and the work that goes on here every day. I leave knowing that during the past year we became a better school and that the future looks bright for the school and its community.

I look forward to my final weeks supporting students, families, and staff members and working on a smooth transition. As always, thank you for your support and be nice, work hard, and do the right thing.
