- Do not send your child to school with a temperature of 100.0 or above
- Notify health office if your child is diagnosis with the Flu or has Flu-like symptoms.
- Students must be fever- free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication before returning to school
- Remind your child to WASH HANDS frequently through out the day.
- Contact your child's doctor for information on receiving the H1N1 vaccine.

Flu Symptom Checklist for Families and Schools The main symptoms of influenza (flu) include fever and cough and/or sore throat. Some people also have a runny nose, body aches, headache, chills, and feel tired. Some people also have diarrhea and vomiting. The most important thing that you can do to keep flu from spreading in the community is to keep your sick child at home when they are sick.				
SHOULD I KEEP MY CHILD HOME?				
YesNo Has your child had a fever of 100.4 degrees or more in the past 24 hours?				
YesNo Does your child have a cough OR a sore throat?				
If you answered <u>YES</u> to <u>both questions</u> above, keep your child home. Your Child has an influenza-like illness.				
CAN MY CHILD RETURN TO SCHOOL?				
YesNo Has your child had a fever of 100.4 degrees or more in the past 24 hours?				
YesNo Has your child had acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Motrin or Advil) in the past 24 hours?				
If you answered NO to both questions above, your child can return to school.				
If you answered <u>YES</u> to one of the questions about, your child <u>CANNOT</u> return to school.				
Keep your child home for at least another day to observe for additional symptoms. Then use the checklist questions again to decide whether you should continue to keep your child home.

It has been a busy time at school as progress reports were sent home last Friday and parent teacher conferences are being held tomorrow, December 10^{th} from 1-4:00 PM. We hope that many of you have had the opportunity to make appointments to talk with your child or children's teachers. There is so much information that can go back and forth in these meetings. Even a short personal interaction can make a difference. I feel connected to the students each morning when I have the chance to say hello or ask the question of the day and get a sense of how every one is doing. In our document for renewal I wrote a sentence about how the children come in smiling at the start of every day and leave smiling when they go home. This is the school that we want and the one I see most of the time. There are certainly real issues and problems and we just want to ask that you communicate relentlessly and directly to help us solve those problems. As many of you may have seen or heard in the news, there is a state ethics law that requires a limits on gifts to teachers. As state public employees, teachers and all school personnel must not accept gifts of a value greater than \$50. The law also states that families **can not** pool funds for a gift to a staff member that amounts to more than \$50. If families want to make a donation to a classroom that is more than \$50, than the gift should go to the school designated for that classroom, or to the library, or some other school use. We had our first tastes of winter weather this week and with this winter weather comes more difficult driving and a more difficult pick up at the end of the school day. To help us with this difficult task we will be distributing signs to post in your cars so that it will be simpler to direct children to proper cars. Please be on the look out for volunteers with markers and oak tag placards to place in windshields. Also please follow all traffic patterns and rules at pick up time including not using your cell phones. Please do not come in the wrong way to the back door or park on the street or adjacent parking lots. If we all follow the same traffic patterns and procedures it will be safer and calmer for everyone.

Just today one of the bus drivers submitted to us an account of an event that occurred during here route off campus in which a driver that did not heed the warning lights from the bus. She wrote the following:

"How Much is a Child's Life Worth?

Dear Parents, Faculty and Commuters of the South Shore Public School,
How many minutes can you spare for a child? Could you find just 3 minutes in your busy commuting schedule to spare for a child? What is more important, being 5 minutes late for work or a child being hit by a motor vehicle? Why does a school bus engage its "stop sign" when the children are not crossing a street? We use our "stop sign" to save lives! We are protecting your children. We have all heard one story or another of a child darting out into the street to fetch a ball, to get away from someone that is bothering them, they slipped and fell on to the street or they were accidently pushed of the curb and were injured. We all try our best to protect our children. The school bus driver is protecting your children by stopping the flow of traffic when they use their red lights and stop sign. Please stop for a school bus and save a child's life."
