From the Executive Director

Winter Concert Tonight

One of my favorite events each year is the Winter Solstice Concert. From early November until the concert, I hear the wonderful voices and music of our students when I walk by the music room. I often drop in and listen to them rehearse their songs. Our two music teachers, Wardie Mannix and Andre Kim, always do such a wonderful job with their selections each year and, of course, practicing with the students. Many thanks to Wardie and Andre and all of the teachers for all of the work that goes into making the Winter Concert such a heart warming and special event! I hope to see you all at the concert later today – it begins at 6:00 o'clock sharp. I also have a special request; please stay to hear all of the groups sing. You will, of course, be impressed by all of the performances and it is so disappointing to the students in grades 7-12 to look out into a dwindling audience. Our concerts are just two evenings a year – so two late nights for the younger students will not really ruin their routines.

Lots of good news as we end the calendar year . . .

Last Friday morning we received the **Charter Final Renewal Site Visit Report**. We have posted the entire report on our website for you to read. We are pleased with the report by Class Measures. In the Board packet that we emailed our trustees late on Friday, I wrote the following: "Overall, we believe that the report is a fairly accurate "snapshot" of what a week at SSCPS is like and we are satisfied with its contents. We plan to use the feedback and recommendations, along with the state's AYP measures for each year, as our guide to move forward and meet (or exceed) the state's goals for us as well as our new accountability plan goals for the next five years. Some excerpts from the report include" "SSCPS has met all measures of faithfulness to charter in the school's Accountability Plan with the exception of one measure that relates to the TerraNova assessment, which is no longer administered. . . . SSCPS has met 14 of the 17 measures of academic program success in its Accountability Plan; the school has discontinued use of one measure relating to Microsoft Office User certification. The measures that the school has met reflect the fact that SSCPS has

established a comprehensive and detailed set of exit standards to ensure that students are obtaining an education that is of high academic quality and aligned with the philosophy of the charter. They cover a number of areas of competency and the school enforces this policy. The unmet measures relate to students' performance on the MCAS mathematics and science and technology tests and the student attendance rate. . . . SSCPS has developed a fully documented curriculum that is aligned with the Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks. The curricula include a variety of commercially developed texts and internally developed materials and resources. The school has a five-year cycle for curriculum review. . . . The team observed an orderly, respectful classroom and school environment at SSCPS. Students were quiet and well behaved; the team saw no disruptive behavior. Teachers had the resources they needed for their instructional programs. . . . SSCPS has met five of the six measures of organizational viability in the school's Accountability Plan. . . . The SSCPS budget supports student achievement. . . . SSCPS is financially solvent and uses effective internal financial controls and oversight. . . . The board of trustees is active and effective in its oversight of the school, the roles of the board and school leadership are clear, and the board is actively engaged in goal setting and strategic planning."

Tomorrow evening is the December BOT meeting and we plan to devote much of the School and Academic Reports section of the meeting to a discussion of the Renewal report. All BOT meetings are open to the public and they begin at 7:00 p.m. They are held in the Great Room.

Equally good news - Governor Patrick will hold his weekly Cabinet meeting at SSCPS!

Well, we were all so happy last Friday when we had the final public report of our site visit and we could make it public. SSCPS accomplished so much over the past year, thanks to the extraordinary work of our teachers, students, and parents (the three legged stool) and the on-going support of our Board of Trustees. We thought that it does not get much better than this. Then, mid-morning on Monday, my Assistant, Pam Algera, takes a phone call from a staff member in Secretary of Education Paul Reville's office. They called to ask if it would be possible for Governor Patrick to have his weekly Cabinet meeting this Friday morning. At first, we really did not believe that this was going to happen to our special charter school! After phone calls to the Governor's Office and a site visit yesterday from his advance person, it is real – we will be hosting the Governor and his group this Friday.

Of course, we had to work out some important logistics and Governor Patrick's schedule is very tight. He will have State Troopers with him and there will be tight security. From 8:30 a.m. to noon, there can be no vehicles parked in the front parking lot. We have arranged for faculty and staff to park in the next lot (as we have done for special occasions in the past). The Governor's advance team requires that there be no "guest" visitors during the time that he is with us. The Cabinet meeting will last an hour and then the Governor will hold a press conference in the Great Room with his cabinet. So . . . the media will be there and we will take lots of pictures. For a brief time, Governor Patrick will speak with some of our student leaders and he is going to watch a repeat performance of the Kassandra's kindergarten class perform Jan Brett's "The Mitten." By 11:30, he will be out the building and driving to his next meeting.

Needless to say we are very excited about this visit and we are honored that Governor Patrick chose SSCPS to host one of his meetings! What an awesome way to finish out 2009!

HEALTH OFFICE

H1N1 CLINIC FOR ALL STUDENTS

The Norwell VNA in conjunction with the town of Norwell will be administering the H1N1 vaccine at SSCPS on December 22, 2009 beginning at 9:00am. The vaccine is available to all students who wish to participate. Permission forms will be distributed to students in grades K-8; High School students should pick up a form at the Health Office. Forms are also available on the front page of the SSCPS website. If you would like your child to receive the vaccine at SSCPS, please read and sign the permission form. Page #1 must be signed and the signing of page #2 is optional.

All permission forms must be signed by a parent / guardian and returned to the Health Office no later than 4pm on Monday the December 21^{st} . Please contact the health office with any questions or concerns.

The flu season is upon us, please remember to:

- Keep your child home if ill with cough, runny nose, sneezing, body aches or chills
- Do not send your child to school with a temperature of 100.0 or above
- Notify health office if your child is diagnosis with the Flu or has Flu-like symptoms.
- Students must be fever- free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication before returning to school
- Remind your child to WASH HANDS frequently through out the day.
- Contact your child's doctor for information on receiving the H1N1 vaccine.

LUNCH PROGRAM

SSCPS will offer a new "pilot" lunch program beginning January 4th serving a variety of new healthy lunches for our students. Attached is a new lunch calendar and new lunch order form for the first two weeks of January. We are asking for you to complete the lunch form for the two weeks and return to us by December 17th. If your child is eligible for free lunch, you still need to submit a completed lunch form in order for lunch to be served to your child. 7-12 PRINCIPAL

As the winter break approaches, I am impressed with the evidence around the school of student efforts to help those in need. For example, the high school is currently engaged in a "food fight" to collect food for area shelters. Students in grades 9-12 are competing by grade to see who can raise the greatest number of canned foods and other supplies. The battle of the grades was organized by the Political Action Workshop and is spearheaded by Victoria Nwafor, who has worked tirelessly to move her classmates into action. The food drive is part of the Workshop's larger year-long effort to increase awareness of poverty and homelessness.

On another note, warnings for the second quarter were sent home to 7-12 families yesterday. Please take some time to go over these reports with your student at home. Families are encouraged to contact teachers to discuss the reports and make plans to improve grades before the close of the term. Now is the time to address problems while there is still time to turn things around.

Project leaders on Level IV distributed Exhibition of Mastery packets this week. While the proposals are not due until after the vacation, students may want to take advantage of the time off to begin working on their projects. Exhibitions of Mastery are a key component of our program that provides students with an opportunity to delve deeply in a topic and engage with the research process. I look forward to seeing the hard work of students pay off when Level II- IV Exhibitions are presented the week of February 8th. I am consistently impressed with the public speaking skills of our students.
