K-6 Principal

Yesterday was the one-year anniversary of the earthquake in Haiti. At SSCPS we have many families with relatives in Haiti and the earthquake touched us all. Today in school we took a moment of silence to honor the spirit, courage and perseverance which are helping to pull the families of Haiti through this horrible natural disaster. The pain and suffering is unimaginable but from what can be seen of the Haitian strength, the will of people is stronger than any disaster and with time and continued support things will get better. We must not forget. May this year be a better year for the people of Haiti and for all of us who know and therefore love Haitians.

On New Years Day I made a resolution: to show more appreciation. Appreciation is something I think about a lot; it is an important part of feedback. The quality of a teacher's feedback to students is an important aspect of good teaching and good teaching along with family support is the backbone of SSCPS' quality education. One part of the volunteering orientation that I particularly enjoy is when the volunteers and I discuss how to give children feedback and how to describe and compliment the child rather than to praise them in absolute terms. In a sense, in these conversations we are having a discussion of how to show appreciation, how to really see and describe so we as adults can encourage hard work and determination.

Just this week I saw one of the finest examples of this concrete specific feedback, and it came from a group of children. I was visiting classrooms as I often do and when I entered Amy Vandenberg's room what first caught my attention was the way all of the children in the room were transfixed by a novel Amy was reading aloud. After the chapter was over a child asked me why I was there and I said because I was very interested in the book and I liked how Amy read. I asked them what they liked about the way Amy read and I got seven distinct and concrete reasons why they loved her reading. The first child told me that she used different voices to be different characters, the second that she was loud enough to hear, the third said that you could tell when it was an important part of the story because she sounded different and you knew to listen carefully, the fourth that Amy could read and look at them to helped you understand what was happening and never lost her place, the fifth said that Amy read in a way that you could picture what was happening in your own mind, a sixth child said that Amy read at different speeds to make it exciting, and the seventh said that her reading taught you how to really focus. The children had really been thinking about what made Amy's reading exceptional and they knew how to put it into words. They not only understood what she did technically to read well, but instinctively understood the purpose of studying her reading to improve their own learning. They could describe just how Amy was working hard and focusing to make the story come alive. Now that was some appreciation! And I will be working all year to try to get to the students' level of specific statements that capture the technical and the overarching qualities that make a piece of work outstanding. As a principal and as a teacher my highest moments of joy, in a joyful profession, are when I learn from children.

Happy New Year and may we all keep learning every day. Please keep Haiti in the forefront of your minds and actions in the coming twelve months. May this be a better year for all the people of Haiti and those who love Haiti and Haitians.


