

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Recently the South Shore Charter Public School hosted a group of graduate students from the Harvard Graduate School of Education who are taking a course on charter school education. The site visit provided four graduate students an opportunity to see theory turned into practice. It also provided our students with the opportunity to meet adult students interested in hearing about their school experiences in our unique environment. It was a welcome opportunity for our school, and we appreciate the commitment of taking an entire day out from packed graduate student schedules to explore our methodology, mission, and vision for the future.

As the graduate students walked through our halls and classrooms, escorted by Jonathan Hagberg and Jackie Perry, they were able to ask students and faculty about the mission of our school and what the day to day life of our school is like. During Projects and Workshops, Level III students were able to discuss our school's mission and what it means to learning. Students expressed their feelings of our school with many telling statements, "I like it here," "They help you learn and achieve your goals," and, "The mission is to learn... if you think it, you can do it." The team of visitors determined that our model of innovative education is deeply student-centered and focused upon individual growth in multiple competencies.

Today provides another strong example of individual growth in multiple competencies as the Political and Social Action Workshop presented Day of the Arts. Jessica Roman, a parent volunteer in the high school Poetry Slam Workshop, read some of her poetry and talked about how life experiences shape who you are as a writer. Our student presenters sang, played live music, and read poetry that is ready for publication. Our student artists were featured on stage. And the Political Action and Social Workshop debuted their documentary, I'm in a relationship and it's Complicated, a film about how our high school students perceive their relationships with others. Earlier this week, I had the unique opportunity to observe Amanda Young and Anaise Trocher as they learned the intricacies of iMovie and the nuances of editing. After countless hours of work, and the guidance of their teacher, Lora Desalvo, a thoughtful and relevant end product was the result. Congratulations to them and to our high school students and faculty who, once again, demonstrated outstanding achievement.
