## From the 7-12 Principal

On Tuesday May $3^{\text {rd }}$ we will be sending two alternatively fueled vehicles to the Massachusetts Annual Statewide Service-Learning Conference at the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester. A group of students from Sarah Roberts’ class will be taking the new hybrid bus and a group of students from Tara Turner’s Workshop will be taking the veggie van. Both groups are presenting their work at the conference and both vehicles represent the efforts of exceptional teachers and students.

Also at the conference both Tara Turner and Sarah Roberts will be honored by the Community Service-Learning (CSL) Advisory Council to the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education as 2011 Service Learning Teacher Leaders. SL Teacher Leaders are recognized for their commitments to implementing service-learning in their classrooms and for engaging students and staff in improving their community. Only six Massachusetts teachers will receive this honor and two of them are from South Shore Charter Public School. The hard work that Tara and Sarah do to promote service learning among both students and staff is evident in the products of their respective Workshop and Project and in their status as mentors to other teachers. It is exciting that their skills and work are being recognized by the state. Both Tara and Sarah were nominated by June Fontaine, our K-6 Project Director. Thank you June for making it possible for the rest of the state to know what we already do about these outstanding teachers.

I had the great pleasure of benefiting from the work of a group of Tara's students earlier this month. Part of
 winning first prize in the Samsung Solve for Tomorrow Competition included a trip to Washington, D.C. and New York City for the students who entered the contest, their teacher, and their principal. I am lucky enough to be Robert Eloi's, Jonathan Jackson's, Kayleigh Wright's, and Jonathan Boyle's principal.

While in Washington our students had the opportunity to meet with both Congressman Bill Keating and Senator John Kerry and discuss environmental issues. Our students were amazing-poised, well-spoken, and clearly knowledgeable. While in New York, Robert and Jonathan appeared briefly in a segment about the contest on Fox News and we all attended the awards ceremony at the Samsung Experience in Columbus Circle. At the ceremony we accepted our prize and had the chance to meet musician John Legend. The trip also gave our students the chance to meet contest winners from four other schools from around the country and to learn about their projects. It was particularly interesting to hear about the experiences of the group of students from another K-12 school in Kokhanok, Alaska. While our graduating classes are small relative to other schools in our area, the entire K-12 enrollment of the Kokhanok School is 31 students! Throughout the trip I felt incredibly proud of Robert, Jonathan, Kayleigh, and Jonathan and of the community that they so beautifully represented. Be on the look out in the coming weeks for pictures and video from our trip.

I'm looking forward to a continued celebration of Projects and Workshops this Saturday as we welcome our new hybrid bus to our community. I hope to see you there.

## Parents Association Job Descriptions

## Chair

- The Chair will have previously held a PA office or have attended a majority of the year's regular PA meetings.
- The Chair will plan the agenda and chair PA meetings.
- The Chair will have monthly meetings with the Executive Director to coordinate some of the PA activities and initiatives.
- The Chair will write a monthly report to the parents to be submitted to the Update (the official SSCPS communication vehicle) at the end of each month.
- The Chair will coordinate all PA committee activities.
- The Chair is the official spokesperson for the PA and as such will make reports to the SSCPS Board of Trustees.
- The Chair will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Chairperson.


## Vice Chair (VC)

- The VC will assist the Chair with meeting organization and appointment of chairs.
- The VC will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming VCs.
- The VC will preside at meetings in the absence of the Chair or if the Chair decides to participate in discussion as a parent only.


## Secretary

- The Secretary will take minutes of the meetings (to be approved at the subsequent meeting), post minutes, post meeting times, and reminders to the Executive Directors office for posting in the SSCPS Update.
- The Secretary will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Secretary.
- The Secretary will help the Chair write the monthly reports.


## Treasurer

- The Treasurer will keep the books of the PA and make monthly reports to the PA.
- The Treasurer will manage the funds disbursement process.
- The Treasurer will write a year-end report in May and submit it to the incoming Treasurer.


## Arts \& Music Committee Chair

Acts as an advocate for all of the Arts in the school curriculum: drama, literature, music and visual arts. Sets up visiting artist schedules, art-related field trips, and works to find grants to fund arts in the school.

## Community Service Committee Chair

Establishes and maintains ties between SSCPS and various community groups, with the purpose of guiding our students towards opportunities for fulfilling their community service requirements. Looks for grants to fund community service programs.

## Fundraising \& Events Committee Chair

Organizes the parent fundraising activities and social events at the school. Each event may have a separate leader to orchestrate activities.

## Health \& Safety Committee Chair

Guides the development of the health curriculum, safety policies and relations with various medical centers, adherence to related health laws, anti-smoking programs, drug prevention programs, medical policies and procedures.

## Library Committee Chair

Participates in all aspects of maintaining the school's library, including ongoing management of the library collection, fundraising to acquire new materials, writing grants, supporting students and teachers in their use of the library, and participating in the creation of an expanded library/media center. The goals for this school year are to update the current collection using a new computerized cataloging system and to partner with community libraries to introduce library skills to our students.

## Volunteer Coordinator Chair

Communicates interesting and rewarding opportunities to volunteer for our students and parents both inside and outside of our school. The Chair also manages the log book for volunteer hours.

## Welcoming \& Events Committee Chair

Contacts families of new, incoming SSCPS students, to welcome them into the school community, and to provide them with information about the school and the Parents Association.

## Grade Representatives K-12:

The role of the Grade Rep is to reach out to all families in his/her grade and serve as a personal link to the SSCPS Parents Association (PA). We hope that all parents will feel involved and connected to the ongoing events and issues in our school even if they are unable to attend the monthly PA meetings. Additional responsibilities include:
o Attending all monthly PA meetings.
o Serving as a conduit for thoughts, ideas, and concerns from families in his/her grade.
o Reporting each month on any happenings, events, or issues in his/her grade.
o Guiding parents in making appropriate connections to school staff and resources as needed.
