## From the K-6 Principal

On Monday May $2^{\text {nd }}$ I saw the future of the South Shore Charter School - and it is bright. It happens every year here, we got a new crop of kindergartners and we sent out a group of seniors. It is part of a cycle that repeats itself year after year because we have the privilege of being a $\mathrm{K}-12$ school. On Monday a group of twelve incoming kindergartners came to visit and we welcomed them and their families into the school. More than half of our incoming K's are siblings of enrolled students and many of these children and families know us and we know them but it was great to spend two hours together. Last year for the first time we had spring intake sessions with families. These sessions help us welcome our new students, complete a state mandated screening, and begin planning for next year, but most importantly it is a chance to meet our future seniors and begin the remarkable journey that is a South Shore Charter School education. It is a real team effort and I would like to thank June Fontaine, Kassandra Sullivan, Carol Wise, Michelle Gallagher, Mary Sofis, Jo Feldman, and Pam Algera. I like these days a great deal because I can read to the students, sit on the floor and build blocks, and get to know children and families. Thanks to all, especially the families that continue to put trust in us to educate their children.

On Tuesday May $3^{\text {rd }}$ June Fontaine, our Service Learning Coordinator, and I traveled as guests to the Annual Service Learning Conference in Worcester. We were going because we both highly value service learning as an important part of our project-based school model. We traveled there in our new hybrid electric bus along with twenty-six third and fourth grade students, Sarah Roberts, and Bill Tramontana. On the road with us were Tara Turner and eleven high school students in the veggie van. This group of 40 was not going as visitors, but as presenters.

The meeting rooms at Holy Cross were packed when we arrived and there was no room for our third and fourth grade students to sit. Most of the tables in the room were full and those that were not full only had a few empty seats. I stood in the middle to the room with the students contemplating what to do, which wall to sit against, when a group of adults got up and gave us their table. Soon others in adjacent tables were making room and the kids got their seats. Well that was the way the day went, everything just seemed to work. The third and fourth grade students gave a wonderful presentation with three videos supporting their works. One video was made by the students with help from last year's Film Workshop, another was a TV news clip announcing our selection as America's Greenest School, and the third was a documentary made by a professional film crew. It was a very moving presentation and the audience of over three hundred stood up and gave them a standing ovation, and not a short one. The folks in the room wanted to stand up and acknowledge the team work and collaboration. It was nice.

A few minutes later I attended the workshop presented by Tara Turner and ten of her students. Tara was presenting a PowerPoint that described how high school workshops are organized here at SSCPS. She explained the model with clarity and talked about how to sustain relationships with outside partners. She told us that the partnership must be helpful and useful, not just to us as a school but also to the partner, or it will not be sustainable. Tara said the key was to exceed expectations. After Tara's introduction the students led fifteen minute rotating discussions at four different stations describing what they did in workshop. It was a wonderful presentation and the time just flew. I learned in great detail about what the students were doing and how they felt about their work. The most interesting part of the presentations for me came when a woman from Quincy asked Jackie Perry about her nutritional survey that contained a great deal of negative information about the eating habits of our high school students. She asked, "What was the reaction of the school to this, did people accuse you of muckraking?" Tara, who was sitting with Jackie, and I just looked at each other quizzically and then Tara responded "No, at our school we challenge each other, Ted will challenge me and I will challenge Ted. It is not that it is perfect, there is no place that is perfect, but we are always pushing ourselves to be better. No, no one accused Jackie of stirring things up." I was so proud to hear our work reflected out to the world in such a positive light.

The trip to Worcester exceeded my expectations thanks to Bill, Sarah, Tara and the students. Oh, and by the way both Sarah and Tara were honored as two of the six teacher leaders of service learning here in Massachusetts. Their work was recognized because June Fontaine wrote up wonderful nominations describing their work. Thanks June, your work as our Service Learning Coordinator exceeds my expectations. So did the bus. We used only a quarter of a tank of gas and the ride was smooth and quiet. It was better than any school bus I had ridden in before.
