K-6 Principal's Report

The weather is turning cooler and it is coat season; I was reprimanded this morning by a Level I student for not wearing a coat as I did my daily sweeping. There are two parts of my day that are like anchors. In the morning the greeting of the students while I sweep, and the calling of names in the afternoon at dismissal. They both have to do with names and acknowledgment and while neither interaction is profound it can let me know how children are doing.

As you will often read in the Update we try to honor the value of a collaborative education between student, teachers/school and families. In these updates Angie and I try to give a window into our life inside the school, to let you know what we see and hear. One element that brings such quality to your children's education that you as families don't get to hear is the discussions among teachers about teaching. Conversations about what makes things hard to learn and how we can bridge those communication difficulties, conversations about what is important to students and how to teach effectively, conversation about what makes good writing. Today I participated in several of these conversations that are a hallmark of SSCPS teaching.

I will describe one that illustrates the care and thoughtfulness of our teachers. On Level I we were discussing this year's Progress Reports. The teachers deliberated on the nuances of every word to be included in the Level I Progress Reports. In most cases after the implication and effectiveness of the words were discussed, consensus developed but in the case of one statement no consensus developed and there was a vote. The vote ended in a tie to be broken the next day with the vote of a missing teacher. The question was if we would be well served by include the phrase "love of numbers" as an objective for a progress report. Now all teachers were in favor of the students' loving numbers and agreed that it was their job to instill this love of the power and patterns of numbers but there was not agreement that the students would be served by including the phrase in progress reports. I am sure that tomorrow at 7:55 when the group will reconvene to decide, the right decision will be made. What is more important than the decision is the deliberation and thought that goes into our teachers' work. It is a great privilege to work with these amazing individuals. It is a difficult time for us as teachers as we search for ways to support our friend and colleague Angella Henry in her family's time of great need (see letter under separate email). In difficult times I find that it helps to return to core values and for me those values are to be kind and to work hard. I see that every day here at SSPCS.
