I would like to welcome all new students and their families to the SSCPS school community. This past Saturday SSCPS held its annual enrollment lottery. The lottery is random and an essential component of the charter school admission process. It is wonderful that we had 536 applicants for our K- 12 school. We were able to accept some students and others were put on the wait list. The good news is that there is a chance some students from the wait list will be offered admission. The unfortunate news is that many will not.

On Monday, two days after the enrollment lottery, SSCPS hosted officials from the Massachusetts Charter Public School Association. Much of this organization's upcoming work will be on lifting the cap on Massachusetts Charter Public Schools. As we move forward with our educational initiatives, and continue to offer families our model of educational innovation, the need for more educational opportunities increases exponentially. Working together, perhaps we can make the wait list a piece of charter school history.
