PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Over the past few months I've had the pleasure and challenge of parenting an infant. Every month I try, often unsuccessfully, to take a photo that captures the anniversary of the day she was born. I realized quickly that this tradition would be short lived as I missed months five, seven, eight and nine. Undeterred by the missing photos in the yet to be made baby book, I took the ten month picture on Saturday. I uploaded that picture and couldn't help but compare it to the newborn pictures from July. My daughter has gone from being completely dependent to pushing for independence, from unaware to highly curious, and from slumbering to incredibly mobile. She now pulls herself up on the furniture, waves to say goodbye, says three words, and knows to hide cheerios with her toys to snack on later. In a short ten months an amazing amount of growth and change has occurred. I rarely take the time to think about this development. Instead, I find myself wondering when the next milestone is going to occur, worrying about whether she is progressing appropriately and wondering if I am supporting her appropriately.

My conversations with teachers and students recently have shown me that your children have also grown incredibly in the past ten months as they've nearly completed another school year. While that change may not be as obvious from photos as it may be for an infant, that growth is clear in their schoolwork, their conversations with adults, and their interactions with their peers. I spent some time with a group of high school students last week during a break. They were talking to one student in particular and commenting on how much he had changed since Level IV, telling him that he has really become a good student. He was not shying away from this praise, clearly pleased with his progress. He said to his friends, "Yeah, I got a 97 in Spanish last term," with a huge smile on his face. Sitting with two teachers today I had the pleasure of hearing about a group of sophomore boys and their dramatic growth from the beginning of the year. This change is not only about academic performance, but about their attitude toward their studies. These teachers have seen a shift in how these students think as they've taken a keen interest in their classes, even those that they struggle in. I was delighted to hear that they "loved everything about *The Great Gatsby*." This is not a conversation we could have had in August.

We all get caught up in everything that needs to get done each day. It is easy to fixate on the difficulties that children have as they develop as students and make their way through school, and to lose sight of the progress. The problems demand more of our attention. We as teachers and parents are often looking ahead to the next goal and the next stage in development as we strive to help children achieve more. As the school year draws to a close I encourage you to take some time to talk to your child about how far he or she has come this school year and to reflect on their achievements. Forget about the struggles and focus on growth and change. What have they learned? What new skills do they have? What new interests do they have? What new relationships have they formed? As we look forward to next year and strive to do better it's important that we reflect on what was accomplished and applaud it, and be present for the moment. Zoe will only be ten months old once and I don't want to rely only on photographs.
