PRINCIPALS REPORT

Yesterday the tent went up for graduation, which will be held this Saturday. As I was standing there looking at the tent going up and hearing the swing of the sledgehammers Linda Weldon said to me, "It is always a bittersweet time of year." She meant that the year is coming to a close and like the line at the end of <u>Time of Wonder</u> by Robert McCloskey, many of us feel "a little bit sad about the place you are leaving, a little bit glad about the place you are going." Linda understands this well because she is the mother of two graduates and sees the tent as a symbol of the beyond and the loss of the present or just plain "bittersweet."

With the end of the year there are many events to celebrate the accomplishments of the year. Please celebrate as many as you can and take the time to acknowledge completion. Tomorrow night is our Spring Concert to be held under the graduation tent. On Tuesday I heard the Kindergarteners and the third and fourth graders practicing for the concert and they sounded wonderful. On Tuesday afternoon I knew that the Kindergarteners were assembled in the Great Room on Level I to practice. I went off to do something in the front of the building and as I returned to Level I down the central hallway I was very disappointed because I had missed the practice. I heard singing and it could not have been Kindergarteners. It seemed that the song was too complex and the singing too nuanced. I was sure I had missed their singing and the first and second graders were singing. To my great surprise when I rounded the corner I had not missed the Kindergarteners – this WAS the Kindergarteners. Please come tomorrow night and please have your children sit with your family when they are not on stage.

Another spring event is the presentation of the Senior Internships. It was exciting to see the seniors back in school for a day. I did not have the opportunity to see the presentations but Angie told me that they were stellar. She told me that many of the students had learned a great deal and that they had been useful in their workplaces. She also told me that several had job offers to continue to work as paid employees. Now this has happened before, and it leads me to believe that our school works.

There was further evidence of that fact a week ago Tuesday when we had a special guest speaker at the full faculty meeting. The speaker knew and knows the school well. Some of the teachers knew her well. She was there to present her Senior Project because it was on our school. Sami Siegel had just graduated from Boston University and seventeen autumns ago she was a new Kindergartener in my class. Sami is now a graphic designer and for her Senior Project she had developed visual symbols that reflected our school. The work was moving and equally impressive was her story about her journey through the school. She said that she had gotten a great deal out of the whole arch of her experience. She told us that she believes that to get the most benefit out of the school, you need to go through all of the Levels. She was proud of her school and we were proud of her. Some staff members cried and as she spoke I could not contain myself and I said, "She was in my class."
