PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As our Seniors finish up their final college applications to meet the last deadlines in February, our Juniors are beginning their work in Junior Seminar and participating in SAT preparation classes. The spring of Junior year is a busy time as students begin the college search process and set the stage for completing High School Exit Standards. While all of the work that students do in every grade contributes to college readiness and helps them become the young men and women that they present to the world through their college applications, college preparation takes on a new look and becomes increasingly urgent for students as their high school careers draw to a close.

In Junior Seminar students will complete a curriculum that requires them to reflect on life beyond high school and how they plan to achieve their goals. Mary Carter, our Director of Guidance, and the Junior advisors will work with students to begin the college search process. Students will visit the National College Fair, go on a college visit, begin work on the Common Application, polish their college essays, and take SAT, SAT II, and ACT exams.

The college acceptance process is long, complex, and often fraught with anxiety. Our students are adding this work to lives that are already full of demanding coursework, extracurricular activities, afterschool jobs, family, and of course their social lives. While college acceptance is important and a graduation requirement, I do not want the college process to be the sole focus of the final years a student spends at SSCPS. One of our guiding principles is that students and the work that they do here are important now. This is as true for our high school students as it is for students on Level I. Colleges look for students who are involved in extracurricular activities and community service not because they are trying to create anxiety in students but as evidence of students who are interesting, interested, social beings and will contribute to campus life. The best way that students can prepare for the college application process is by living in the now and working hard, the same things that have guided their work since kindergarten.

I feel that the best way we can help our students strike the right balance between planning for their lives after high school and enjoying their lives now is in preparing them for what to expect as they move into their Senior year. In response to the processes we've seen with previous classes and feedback from students, families, and faculty we will be increasing our SAT/ACT test prep for Juniors. Mary and I will also be holding meetings with 11th graders and their parents this spring to discuss next steps for individual students. Junior parents should plan on attending Junior Parent Night on March 6th where we will explain to parents what they should expect in the coming months. While our Juniors are formally beginning the exit process our entire community works everyday to support students in work that is both important now and contributes to success in college. 


