PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The call for input on the Strategic Plan has allowed us the time to have important discussions about who we are as a school and where we hope to be in the next five years. I have had the opportunity to be part of conversations with a variety of stakeholders across the Levels in our building. The process has led me to think about the past five years, the work we have done to fulfill our mission, and the work that is left to do. In all of the discussions that I have been a part of, participants have raised the importance of our K-12 identity. When I was a teacher new to our building almost a decade ago now, I questioned how thirteen grades could exist peacefully and productively under one roof. I wondered how the thread of one mission could connect teachers and students as they worked on early reading skills and college level calculus in the same building.

I quickly found that being in a K-12 setting has its challenges. We learned to coexist that year, but we did not live up to the potential of K-12. Even though the youngest children interacted only infrequently with the oldest there were concerns from parents, students, and teachers that continually came up. It was often easier to stay apart than to try to work collectively. Our high school, middle school, and elementary school somehow navigated that year of great change together despite hurdles. Having K-12 in one building came at the same time as a sharp expansion in the student body, the introduction of many new staff members, and a significant move. Being together was only one of our challenges, but it was a considerable one.

We have come a long way since our early days in this building. During discussions about the strategic plan I've heard stories of the many ways that K-12 benefits our students. This has helped to reaffirm what I already knew. Our younger children are confident and are more comfortable around adults and older children because they have the opportunity to interact with them in the halls daily. Similarly, exposure helps our older children be respectful and considerate of the needs of others. For our faculty watching our children mature across Levels as they prepare to leave us is a great source of joy. The presence of K-12 faculty at graduation shows this. Now instead of wondering how K-12 can work, I question why more schools aren't doing what we are doing.

Our faculty and students take advantage of our being K-12 in many ways every day. Many of our older students volunteer in the classrooms of younger students, mentoring relationships exists across Levels, Projects and Workshops pair up for events across the school, and some of our high school students lead FIT classes on the lower Levels. Whenever I see students interacting across Levels I always want to do more of it. The opportunity that came when we all moved to this building in Norwell nine years ago allowed us to work to become a seamless K-12 school. The process of working on the strategic planning has provided yet another reminder of what a wonderful opportunity being together is. As we move forward, building on our former goals and developing new ones, I am glad that we took the time during this busy month to reflect on how wonderful it is to be a K-12 school.


