## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As we see the natural signs of spring all around us in the longer days and blooming flowers we are also seeing the arrival of spring in the life of our school. The English Language Arts MCAS is out of the building, the third quarter has come to an end, and our Seniors are participating in Senior Debates and taking their finals as they prepare to start their internships following the vacation. In all of this our twelfth graders are also grappling with decisions about which college they will attend in the fall.

April can be a difficult month for high school Seniors as they celebrate their college acceptances, but lament their rejections. This college admissions season saw yet another dramatic increase in applications for seats at competitive schools. The result is that many outstanding, deserving students across the country have found themselves facing rejection from schools they have long dreamed about. The numbers are staggering. At Tufts University applications were up by 11% this year, New York University saw a rise of 17%, and the University of Chicago's applications went up 20%. This trend is not just happening at private universities; public schools are also breaking application records as the exponentially rising cost of college encourages more students to consider state options.

It is important to keep in mind the key role that marketing plays in these figures. Lower acceptance rates at colleges drive higher selectivity ratings, an important component of the college rankings that appear in publications like *US News & World Report*. Colleges and universities throughout the country are working to gather an ever-growing pool of applicants both to increase their rankings and attract a stronger, more diverse student body. The availability of data about students through channels such as registrations for PSATs and SATs provides colleges with information about high school students that allows them to appeal to the students at a personal level. Schools are increasingly sending recruiters all over the country to meet with students directly at school and tell them about their programs. Trends such as moving to the Common Application and providing free applications to students make it easier and more attractive for students to apply. High school students should expect to receive a large volume of personalized emails, letters, and brochures in the mail as they are courted by schools. The result is that students are applying to more schools than ever before with application counts higher than a dozen no longer standing out as unusual.

Trends in college marketing and current statistics do not mean that students shouldn't apply to the schools that they are dreaming of. What it means is that students need to be informed about their choices and make decisions after visiting campuses, exploring online, and asking pointed questions. Students need to keep in mind that business concerns drive the college process and that schools are benefiting from attracting students to apply, even though they will eventually reject many of them. They need to make sure that their list of applications is realistic, and represents a good use of their time and effort. Our Seniors are currently finishing up this research as they prepare to send their initial deposits to the schools that they ultimately choose. For Juniors the April vacation presents an excellent opportunity for college tours while students are still on college campuses, providing a more realistic picture of life at the school. Mary Carter and I are currently meeting with Juniors and their families to help them get on track with this process. We will resume Junior Parent Meetings following the vacation. Please contact me or Mary to schedule an appointment.

One more sign of spring is the busy planning for next school year. As in previous years we will be holding Parent Coffees to provide updates for each Level and answer the questions of parents who will be new to the Level. The appropriate principal and Level Coordinator will be in attendance. Each Parent Coffee will be held in the Music Room from 8:30-9:30. Please plan on attending the Parent Coffee for the Level your child will be on next year. We look forward to meeting with you. Do not hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns.

Talking on the phone in line, putting your phone on speaker and placing it on your lap in hopes that I don't see it in line, using an Ipad in line, reading a book while driving in line, doing a crossword puzzle in line, having the newspaper spread out across the dashboard in line, eating a whole chicken dinner driving towards me while trying to avoid your elbow from hitting the mashed "potatahs" in line, thinking that its okay once you've picked up your children to then get on the phone before exiting the property.

We all know the pickup line is long. The thing that I'm asking is that once 3 o'clock hits, please put down your smart devices, books, crossword puzzles, magazines and chicken dinners and give your full attention to your part in our children's rights to a safe environment.
