Description of Grade Rep Position:

- Grade Representatives are required to liaise with same-level counterparts and produce a Level Report at each monthly PA meeting. Same-level Grade Representatives should decide which of them will deliver the Level Report at each PA meeting, but all Grade Representatives are required to communicate with Level Coordinators, teachers, and parents to inform their reports.
- Grade Representatives should include in their reports details of upcoming Level happenings, rather than updates on past events. They should liaise with the Level Coordinator to pass on important messages
- Grade Representatives should communicate important information with the parents in their grade and act as first points of contact for parents with questions or concerns. They should then direct parents to the appropriate person or group in the school.
- Should Grade Representatives become aware of an issue that may be relevant to the PA, they should discuss it with the PA Chair for possible inclusion in a future PA meeting agenda.
