PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Last week was Thanksgiving and in my observation of classrooms earlier that week I saw some wonderful lessons about the holiday. I saw one which connected the words thankful and grateful and children were asked to write about things for which they were thankful and grateful. In honor of the season and the wonderful teaching I see every week here at SSCPS I thought I would try to complete such an assignment for this report and write about some things for which I am grateful and thankful that have happened in the past year.

I am grateful for the start of the school year and its annual new beginning. It is wonderful to be in a profession where there are such strong cycles and patterns and yet there is a sense of progress and growth. There is enough continuity and enough change, enough new kindergarteners each year and graduates we have known since kindergarten.

I am grateful to the teachers of SSCPS because they share with me a commitment to knowing all of our students and teaching them all well. When I was a twenty-three I got to know the artist Frank Stella and I asked him for a job in his studio. He told me that he worked with all kinds of caustic materials and that I did not need to work for another artist, that I had what was needed. He told me that what had been essential for him was finding a peer group and together they had changed art. He told me that if artists found each other at the right moment then with that collective energy and thought something new could come into the world. In the seventeen years where my primary profession was making art I had many friends and artists that I admired but I never found that collective group. I am thankful that here at SSCPS I do have such a group of peers and collectively we are making something new. It feels very good to be part of a great experiment that after eighteen years really works. As an artist I did not find the group Frank Stella talked about finding and which made a difference for him. I am thankful I have found that group in my current profession, teaching. It was not the group I thought I was looking for but as Robert Frost tells us, "way leads on to way" and Mick Jagger tells us, "you get what you need."

I am grateful to work in a collective school administration with amazing support staff who makes us collectively better than we are as individuals. I love working with folks who are wise, insightful and principled, who "know" from experience, who see the details, and who are efficient. I talk at times to sixth graders who tell me that they are sad that I will not be their principal next year. I tell them that I am not sad because I will still see them and that they are going to have a principal who really understands and is much better than I would ever be when they are older. I am thankful that I work for a leader who wrote this sentence in last week's update, "*Yet there we were on a Saturday afternoon sitting in the music room discussing successful life outcomes, human potential and a goldfish bowl*." It was a sentence I had never read or thought before but encapsulated the dilemma of our school's accomplishment and the pain in not being able to help more students. I am grateful for books, music, art, and thankful for my garden, cold frame and the radio.

I am grateful that my mother is living a life which still has moments of joy. In the last three or so years she has had primary progressive aphasia and her speech and understanding of the world has gotten smaller with each week but she is still my mother. As her ability to relate to the larger world has changed, she has almost become the essence of herself. I am thankful to all of the people who help take care of her and especially to my father who has shown me what love looks like in its ending chapters. I have always admired him but never more than now in his 85th year.

I am thankful for my children and my wife Katy. I am grateful for this school, its children and families.
