PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Yesterday we inducted 14 new members into the National Honor Society in a ceremony that celebrated the many accomplishments of this exceptional group. Induction into the National Honor Society recognizes student excellence in the four areas required for membership: scholarship, leadership, community service, and character. These four areas are not only the foundation for National Honor Society, but they echo what we stand for at South Shore Charter Public School: inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life. The process for student selection is rigorous. Juniors and Seniors that meet GPA requirements are provided with the opportunity to apply for membership. Next, students must complete an application that outlines their activities, leadership positions, and community service projects. Along with the application students are asked to submit an essay that describes how they have demonstrated excellence in the four characteristics during their high school years. A team of faculty members then meets to discuss each of the applications.

For the first time this year I sat in on this process and had the pleasure of reading all of the essays. It was so satisfying to read about the significant accomplishments of these students and to hear about how much students have both learned here at SSCPS and given back to this community. Students were asked not to be modest, a request that many told me was difficult. Leaving modestly aside allowed students to share the many things they do outside of this building that we don't see everyday. I was struck by how hard they work and how much they are juggling. Our students not only put their all into what they do here, but many are committed to significant service projects in their towns, are heavily involved with their religious communities, devote a great deal of time to sports outside of the school, work at afterschool jobs, and are balancing all of this with often complicated social and families lives. I found some excerpts particularly striking and thought that the community would benefit from hearing a line or two from each new member's essay.

"As for character, my school and I share the same ideals. South Shore Charter Public School is a place where everyone is accepted."

"There are many causes I believe in strongly and I will stand up for them to the best of my ability."

"As a student at this school I am required to complete a designated amount of hours of community service per year. What began as a compulsory exercise has bred a love of service in me; as an older student I find myself volunteering often. Through service I earn the satisfaction of helping others and provide useful services to people that need them most."

"Whenever I have the chance to help someone I take that chance to help them. I know to keep my head held high and to look toward the future while doing anything I can for others along the way."

"When I started my high school years I wanted to do the best that I could. I started 9th grade earning second honors all throughout the year but I knew I could do better. Starting my sophomore year I pushed myself even harder. I wanted to become a first honors student. That year I took Chemistry, the hardest class I had ever taken. I didn't know if I could handle the complex content but I took the time to study and asked for extra help. My confidence started to build. I worked hard to achieve; I was able to put myself out there and not be afraid to speak."

"I have always taken pride in my work and I do my best to complete assignments to their fullest. I have the charter school to thank for this academic confidence. The teachers I have been with have pushed and prepared me to continue to make progress throughout high school."

"I tend to 'think outside the box' and go against common ideas, substituting them with what I believe to be right."

"I am a hard worker and a strong individual. When I put my mind to something, I do everything in my power to achieve it. When I make a commitment, I stand by it."

"I have learned the significance of being a devoted student as well as a reliable employee. I organize my time in a way that allows me to perform the necessary duties of a student. I plan out each day so that my time is not wasted. The skills this experience is teaching me will always be needed."

"I have loved learning my entire life always throwing myself, headfirst, into the topics presented to me."

"I have been a mentor assigned to two young swimmers on my swim team. Here I am responsible for helping them with goal-setting, skill development for swimming and for life, and anything else they may need help with. I have developed a strong bond with these young swimmers and they often come to me for help in more than just swimming."

"My next step in service is to complete my Eagle Project and give back to this school. It is a way of showing gratitude to my second home, for helping me become the individual I am today."

"I have never been a leader for anything. I was never a captain in dodgeball or picked to head a project. Others were put in a place of power instead of me but when there was a chance to step up I did. When things start to fall apart, I come in and help clean up the mess. Each day I get better at being the leader I know I can be. I believe that SSCPS brings out the best in me. I feel like I can be me, no one else."

This is truly an outstanding group. Congratulations new members of the National Honor Society!


Liam Nelson – **Level III** - For over a year Liam Nelson level III has been collecting aluminum soda cans and their tabs. The cans are delivered every two or three weeks to Hull seaside Cat Rescue. The tabs are twisted off and collected for Shriner's Children's Hospital Burn centers. The hospital treats all children suffering from burns at no charge.

From the McGuiness Family "GEAR UP FOR WINTER!! In the cold winter months, children living in homeless and low-income situations face a new set of challenges. For families already stretching budgets to pay for rent, heat, and groceries, providing a warm winter coat and other winter essentials is often not an option. Kevin and Madison McGuiness volunteer monthly at the Cradles to Crayons Giving Factory and are running a Winter clothing drive at SSCPS. There will be a collection box in the front lobby where you can leave new or gently-used winter essentials (coats/gloves/boots etc).
