#### FROM THE K-6 PRINCIPAL

In many ways yesterday was a typical day for me at the South Shore Charter Public School. It was a day of important meetings – significant conversations in person, by e-mail and on the phone with families – joyful and difficult conversations with students – and collaborations with teachers. But there was also something different about yesterday. It was the day we learned that Pete Seeger had died.



I grew up on Pete Seeger. My family had four Smithsonian Folkways records of Pete Seeger. They were titled American Favorite Ballads volumes I-IV

and were recorded between 1957 and 1961. As a child I would listen and sing to them for hours and I knew most of the words. Many of those songs are the songs that are in the Core Knowledge Sequence and central to Wardie Mannix's music classes on Levels I and II and yesterday Wardie was at school. I spent almost two full periods with Wardie and Level I students singing and listening to the songs that Pete sung. Nineteen years ago when we started this school we sang the songs Pete sang. And today we are still singing them.

I visited Kassandra and Melissa's Kindergarten class (on Fridays my Kindergarten class), and the students asked me to sing "The Fox. I said, let's hear Pete sing "The Fox" and in less than ten seconds Kassandra had Pete singing "The Fox" on her phone. It was an amazing blend of the old traditional song and the new technology that brought Pete before all of our ears instantly. Much has changed in the nineteen years of our school. When we started there was no Google to search for Pete Seeger much less smartphones to play his music instantly. Later in the day in Amy's Pod, Wardie had a projector that was connected to the internet and we were traveling the web seeing and hearing Pete sing his songs. We saw, "We Shall Overcome," "Wimoweh," and the version of "This Land is Your Land" sung at Barak Obama's First Inaugural. All this history at the click of a few buttons. The class ended with the children each saying their favorite songs: "Ol' Dan Tucker," "Jericho," "Erie Canal." Wardie and I would tell them if that was a song that Pete had helped make famous. Most of the songs they asked about were songs that Pete had sung. One child asked about "Abiyoyo." I stopped and was silent for a while as "Abiyoyo," is a song and story Pete had made up for children and a book I often read at Literacy Night. I asked her why she had chosen "Abiyoyo." She told me that her mother had read it to her the night before; right as Pete was leaving this world she was hearing his story. It made me feel good that in some small way the experiences I had as a child were being shared by these children. Before yesterday almost no child had known Pete Seeger by name but they had all heard the songs he loved and that made me proud.

The good feelings about this school are becoming widely known and the lottery is coming up. If you have a sibling in your family whom you would like to have come to our school next year, **you must drop off the application by Wednesday, February 5 at 5:00pm.** If you know of any other SSCPS family who has a sibling who does not go to this school please remind them. All of the spots will fill up in the Lottery and if you do not get your paperwork in on time we will not be able to teach those children.

We are starting the cycle again and who knows how we will be teaching kids when those new kindergarteners leave this school in thirteen years. One thing is certain we will still be singing and I hope we are still singing many of Pete's songs.
