



FROM THE 7-12 PRINCIPAL

For our high school Seniors a series of important deadlines have come and gone as most colleges have regular decision application due dates in January and February. The approach to those deadlines can be incredibly stressful for students and for the parents and teachers who support them. Finally clicking "Submit" on the Common Application website signifies the culmination of a long, challenging process that truly begins when students enter school in kindergarten. Our faculty works hard to provide students and their parents with the information and assistance they need to manage the process successfully and alleviate some of the anxiety. As a school we have always supported 11th and 12th grade students and their families in the college application process, both during the school day and through parent nights. Students spend half of their Junior year and half of their Senior year in weekly seminars led by Mary Carter, Director of Guidance, working through the college application process. We offer informational nights for the parents of Juniors and Seniors to provide guidance about the application process, financial aid, and the steps to graduation. For the parents of Seniors, hands- on help with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) forms is available here at school and through events in the outside community.

In an effort to help families begin discussing college earlier we are expanding our offerings to parents in earlier years. We are beginning this year with the addition of an informational night for the parents of tenth graders. Next year we will include middle school parents with a focus on financial planning. For parents looking to start now a great deal of information and advice regarding college financing is available from the Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority (MEFA) at <u>www.mefa.org</u>. It is worth exploring the website to get a sense of the current financial trends and how parents can best prepare.

The agenda for our new Sophomore Parent Night is designed to prepare parents for what they should expect as their children complete graduation requirements and begin the college process. Our focus will be on the college course requirement, testing (MCAS, PSAT, SAT/ACT, SAT II), admission trends, financial trends, and next steps. Our goal is to help families begin the conversation early and relieve some of the stress associated with this process.

Tenth grade parent night was originally scheduled for the evening of February 5th. Due to the inclement weather, we have moved the program to Wednesday, February 26th at 6pm. Mary Carter and I hope to see many of our tenth grade families there. If you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to contact me.
