FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The South Shore Charter Public School is a unique learning community committed to bringing out the best in every student as they reach for their individual goals. What makes SSCPS unique is our student body representing over twenty-six sending districts from around the south shore. At SSCPS we view each student as an active learner, each with unique talents and gifts to share within this community. Our faculty is committed to our students, their hopes and aspirations, and their successful life outcomes. We ask students to set their goals high, and then to work hard in building the foundation of those aspirations.

Last Thursday we held a coffee so that our parent community could learn more about the upcoming PARCC assessment field test. We discussed the now seventeen-year-old MCAS and the shortcomings of the old assessment and statewide curriculum frameworks that have been discovered over time. Found to be particularly compelling was a DESE statement made in January. As part of the rationale for transitioning to a new assessment system, DESE states that the MCAS was "never designed to measure the college and career readiness of students." Additionally, despite efforts from school districts across the state, 40 percent of high school graduates from public schools entering state colleges and universities have to enroll in remedial, non-credit coursework to be ready for the reading, writing and math rigors of higher education.

At the South Shore Charter Public School we have known for quite some time now that the MCAS does not align with two assessments colleges and universities use to evaluate students for admission, the SAT and the ACT. We have used MCAS data to inform instruction, we have used MCAS data to identify students at risk, and we have used the data to evaluate ourselves as a school. We have never used the test as a determiner of college readiness. Instead, we have added Honors and Advanced Placement coursework over time as our high school expands. We have always asked more of our students, and we will continue to ask our students to think critically, to question intellectually, and to problem solve at advanced levels. It is our mission to prepare all students for academic success and the opportunities this success brings in academics, service, and life. An outstanding faculty, hardworking students, and unprecedented parental support sustain accomplishment.

As parents of children in public schools, it is imperative to continue to ask questions about the education your child receives. Those questions founded our school over nineteen years ago. On Thursday, our parents asked important questions, some very specifically addressing the alignment between standards-based assessments and childhood growth and development. We know that as a school we will never replace art or music with touch-typing. We know there is no technology that replaces the magic that happens when an adult reads a book to a child. Instead, we actively question the appropriate amount of screen time for our children. We question the sacrifice of reduced instructional time to accommodate ongoing assessments. We question the real role assessment plays in teaching and learning. Questions we must continue to ask, our children's successful life outcomes are at stake.
