## FROM THE 7-12 PRINCIPAL

Our Seniors have less than four weeks left in the classroom before they take their last round of high school finals and go out on Senior Project. Despite the current frigid weather and endless snow, it is really just a blink of an eye before they are sweating in their caps and gowns under the tent on a (hopefully) sunny June day. It always seems like a sprint from the end of March to the end of the school year.

Before they can say goodbye to SSCPS, our graduating Seniors are faced with deciding on the next step in their education. For students who applied regular decision, acceptance letters and emails are trickling in. The mood is one of anxious excitement. For most, the end of the anticipation and stress associated with the college application season cannot come soon enough. Unfortunately for many, the next phase of the process, deciding where to send that deposit check, can be the biggest challenge. Often these acceptances come in before financial aid packages are mailed, leaving families in an uncomfortable situation. While there is excitement and possibility, there is also the reality of not yet knowing if they can make it work.

Once families finally receive their financial aid packages they must decipher what they mean, an often daunting task, and determine the most prudent choice. Discussions around financing a college education can be difficult ones for parents to have with their children. For many parents this is the first time that they've had honest conversations with their children about the family's finances. These are not discussions that every family is comfortable having. It can be incredibly challenging for parents to help their children understand the true value of the astronomical figures that appear on tuition bills. Our system of higher education puts a great deal on young people who are only 17 or 18 years old. Students must decide if they are willing to take on tens of thousands of dollars in debt before they have a true understanding of what it takes to pay that money back.

As parents, we want to encourage our children to go to the school of their dreams and not have financial realities get in the way, but the trends in college costs are daunting. The graduating class of 2013 left college with over $\$ 35,000$ in college-related debt, up from $\$ 9,000$ just 20 years ago. Wages have certainly not risen at the rate that this figure has. The cost of tuition across the country, at both public and private colleges, has more than doubled during this same time period. Because of the knowledge of the system and effort required to navigate the complicated financial aid system, the rise in costs has disproportionately hit low income families and those students who are first generation to college. As a school we are working hard to counter this aspect of the problem by connecting families with resources both when they are applying for aid and when the financial packages come in. Mary Carter, Director of Guidance, in working with students to help them understand the different types of aid offered by schools, and help them determine the bottom line figure. MEFA, the Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority, has many resources on their website. They also offer free seminars across the state titled "After the Acceptance Letter" that address payment options, award letters, the billing process, and working with financial aid offices. As a school, getting students to college is important and is central to our work. It is important, but is not the only measure of success. We require students to gain acceptance to a college and support this process, but know that there are many factors that contribute to the decision students make when they finally decide where they are headed after high school. The choice is a very personal one.

Students and their parents have a lot to celebrate when a graduating Senior moves on to a college where they can thrive as they continue to prepare for life and work. It is important that students and their parents realize that there are many different places where students can flourish, and that the college experience is largely what one makes of it. It is vital that families weigh all of the options, including the debt burden that students will face after graduation.

In the years that I have worked as 7-12 principal I have seen college admissions become increasingly competitive and complicated, particularly around the financial aspect. I worry that the competitive nature of modern college admissions forces families to focus on the college acceptance so blindly that they forget what they really should be celebrating: the joys, achievements, and learning experiences students find along the way. I hope that our Seniors and their parents take advantage of the final weeks of their K-12 education to celebrate.
