



## FROM THE 7-12 PRINCIPAL

Last Saturday, June 7th, we celebrated our newest class of South Shore Charter Public School graduates at our 19th commencement. The end of the year is full of exciting events and milestones for our students but commencement is what all of us, K-12, are ultimately working toward. Graduation at South Shore Charter Public School truly is a celebration of our entire community and it is the culmination of many years of hard work on the part of students, parents, and teachers. This was made clear on Saturday. At our ceremony any Senior who chooses to do so may speak. This year Katie Aucella, Chad Bruce, Cory Clark, and Jonathan Boyle took that opportunity. All four of them explained to us that they had personally come far since they entered kindergarten. In doing so they demonstrated how much we have matured as an institution in those years. They were incredibly impressive. Our graduating students chose Lora DeSalvo as their commencement speaker. Her powerful words which spoke directly and personally to our students reminded all of us that our students are leaving us to go into an incredibly challenging world. I know that they are ready for that challenge.

Seeing the class of 2014 graduate was particularly emotional for me because I have worked with so many of these students for so long. Back when we used to place students in Project across Levels and I taught on Level III, several of these students were in my Project as third and fourth graders. They helped me acclimate to the culture of the school and helped shape me as a teacher in my first years here. I taught more than half of them math, history, or both when they moved up to Level III. Nineteen of our 36 graduates were here as fifth and sixth graders. When this group moved up to Level IV I went with them and was their history teacher. Not quite done with this group yet, I stepped into the 7-12 principal role during their eighth grade year and followed them up into the high school. It has been an honor to watch them grow and learn. This time I will not be moving up with them, but I look forward to hearing about what the next stage brings. I will miss them.

Graduation is the culminating event in a busy Senior season. In order for Senior events and graduation to run smoothly many people put in a great deal of effort. I'd like to thank Mark Flanagan and Paul Norkus for their work to make sure that the event spaces were prepared, beautiful, and comfortable. Pam Algera, who is behind the scenes of all SSCPS events, deserves thanks for her extensive work on the graduation details from invitations to diplomas. I also need to thank Jo Feldman and Kathy Sobol for their help with rehearsal, set up, and the graduation reception. Finally, I'd like to extend a special thank you to Mary Carter, our Director of Guidance, for her orchestration of Senior Project, prom, Senior Dinner, and graduation. Most importantly Mary worked tirelessly all year with our Seniors to guide them through the college application process and their internships as she prepared them for the next steps in their lives.

The arrival of graduation signifies the wind down of the school year and the beginning of our 7-11<sup>th</sup> grade students preparing for final exams. Final exams are an important measure of student progress and an opportunity for students to demonstrate what they have learned over the course of the school year. The data from final exams helps students assess their progress and informs the work of our teachers. Below please find the final exam schedules for both Level IV and the High School. High School students are dismissed at 12:00 on Thursday 6/12, at 10:30 on Friday 6/13, and at 12:00 on Monday 6/16. Please make arrangements for your students to be picked up at that time. On Tuesday, June 17<sup>th</sup> students on Level IV will have their Eighth Grade Awards Ceremony beginning at 10:30am over at the PE space. Parents may go directly to the PE space for the event. Following the ceremony there will be a small reception for students and their families at the same location. We will have a sign-out sheet available at the PE space for families that would like to take their eighth grader home following the ceremony.
