FROM THE 7-12 PRINCIPAL

The best parts of my week this fall were spent in the Mac lab working with our Seniors on the task of completing their college essays. Early action and early decision deadlines are closing in with most schools requiring applications for the earlier timeline by November 1st, November 15th or December 1st. At one time these dates impacted few students, but that is quickly changing. Last year a full forty percent of our students applied to college early. Based on what we are hearing from students, I expect similar numbers this year. The increased level of anxiety surrounding the college application process is one force behind this trend.

All of our students, whether or not they are applying early, have begun the application process and most are up and running on the Common Application website. The biggest hurdle for students as they complete the applications, once they compile a list of schools, is almost always the personal essay. This can be a significant contributor to student anxiety.

Every member of the Senior class wrote a college essay during their Junior year. The assignment formally became part of the high school writing portfolio in our last school wide revision. While the essay is a class assignment, I noticed last year that most students were not happy with the essay that they wrote the previous year when it came time to apply. They found that they had changed in that year, wanted to emphasize different things about themselves, or had new found motivation to produce something better. Unfortunately, the job of starting a new essay from scratch, combined with all of the other stresses of Senior year is a sizable task for students to take on. By the time students are in high school they have enormous difficulty writing about themselves. The essay demands a type of writing that students are rarely asked to do in an academic setting.

Last year I taught College Essay Support as an option during Focused Instructional Time (FIT) on a volunteer basis. Perhaps not surprisingly, my class was small. Every student in that section had the opportunity to get feedback on their work as they went through the process. Most importantly, the FIT placement provided students with 45 silent minutes a week when all that they could do was write the essay. I was watching. This proved to be both the key to fighting procrastination and an effective strategy for curbing anxiety.

Due to that positive experience, all Seniors are now required to be enrolled in a College Essay Support FIT during the first quarter. Last year's group suggested this. I have had the opportunity to read each student's work. While as adults, we may see teenagers as having a hard time seeing beyond themselves, watching students try to write about themselves is telling of just how difficult self-analysis can be. As their teachers and parents we know that each of them has a great deal to offer and can impress the admissions officer on the other side of the page. That can be difficult for them to see. The available time helps and provides an important opportunity for us to supply encouragement.

While I have known some of these Seniors since they were fifth graders in my math class, I learned something new about each of them through this process. The students in this group have overcome failures, triumphed athletically, turned disabilities into abilities, entered adulthood within their cultural communities, given generously to others, and succeeded in the face of extreme stress at home. They are an impressive group and I am extraordinarily grateful for this opportunity to get to know them better. The schools they will enter next fall are incredibly lucky.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. **South Shore Charter Public School** offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.75; lunch costs \$3.25. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch.

- 1. Do I need to fill out an application for each child? No. Complete only one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Charlene Evans, Food Services Coordinator, 781-982-4202.
- 2. Who can get free meals? All children in households receiving benefits from MA SNAP, MA TAFDC or the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.



If you have received a NOTICE OF DIRECT CERTIFICATION for free meals, do not complete the application. But do let the school know if any children in your household are not listed on the Notice of Direct Certification letter you received.

- 3. CAN FOSTER CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Yes, foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court, are eligible for free meals.
- 4. Can homeless, runaway, and migrant children get free meals? Yes, children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals. If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail Angie Pepin, 7-12 Principal, 781-982-4202 or apepin@sscps.org.
- 5. WHO CAN GET REDUCED PRICE MEALS? Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Eligibility Income Chart, shown on this application.
- 6. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school at **781-982-4202** if you have questions.
- 7. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT ANOTHER ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 8. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILD(REN) GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.
- 9. Will the information I give be checked? Yes and we may also ask you to send written proof.
- 10. If I don't qualify now, may I apply later? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.

- 11. What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Alicia Savage at 781-982-4202 or email asavage@sscps.org or by mail to 100 Longwater Circle, Norwell, MA 02061.
- 12. May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen? Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be U.S. citizens to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
- 13. Who should I include as members of my household? You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends) who share income and expenses. You must include yourself and all children living with you. If you live with other people who are economically independent (for example, people who you do not support, who do not share income with you or your children, and who pay a pro-rated share of expenses), do not include them.
- 14. What if my income is not always the same? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 15. We are in the military. do we include our housing allowance as income? If you get an off-base housing allowance, it must be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income.
- 16. My spouse is deployed to a combat zone. is her combat pay counted as income? No, if the combat pay is received in addition to her basic pay because of her deployment and it wasn't received before she was deployed, combat pay is not counted as income. Contact your school for more information.
- 17. *My family needs more help. Are there other programs we might apply for?* To find out how to apply for MA SNAP or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or call the MA SNAP Hotline **1-866-950-3663**

SHARING INFORMATION WITH MEDICAID/SCHIP

Dear Parent/Guardian:

If your children get free or reduced price school meals, they <u>may</u> also be able to get free or low-cost health insurance through Medicaid or the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP). Children with health insurance are more likely to get regular health care and are less likely to miss school because of sickness.

Because health insurance is so important to children's well-being, the law allows us to tell Medicaid and SCHIP that your children are eligible for free or reduced price meals, unless you tell us not to. Medicaid and SCHIP only use the information to identify children who may be eligible for their programs. Program officials may contact you to offer to enroll your children. Filling out the Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application does not automatically enroll your children in health insurance.
