FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

On Saturday the South Shore Charter Public School hosted over 380 visitors at our first Open House of the enrollment season. In meeting with many prospective families, and hearing so many stories, our school community is provided a snapshot assessment of public education throughout our twenty-six sending districts. During the Open House, we like to provide prospective families with a solid understanding of who we are as a school, as well as a feeling of what it is like to be a student here at SSCPS.

An important story told during Open House has become the history of our school. Not only do prospective families learn about the intent of the school's founders, families also learn how that original intent has grown into the current teaching and learning happening throughout the levels. Although we have worked hard to retain what we most value, we have also worked hard to grow into what we have become. We are indeed a very different school from our beginnings of three shore side buildings in Hull. We are also very different from who we were ten years ago when we relocated to our current building in Norwell.

The charter school movement has grown in parallel, reflecting twenty years of the systemic evolution that occurs when original intent adapts to the ongoing impact of statewide education policy and public perception. Being among the first charter schools in Massachusetts, we have an interesting perspective of not only our school and the past twenty years, but of charter schools as disruptive innovation.

During student-led tours, meet and greet with faculty, and presentations in the music room, there were questions parents and students asked consistently. Questions about a day in the life of an SSCPS student were frequent; as were questions about the curriculum, educational programming, teacher to student ratio, learning services, extracurricular opportunities, and the college readiness of our graduating seniors. However, many of the questions were about charter schools in general. In the music room, prospective families asked detailed and well-developed questions about the lottery, many expressing bewilderment at the random process of student selection we are mandated to implement. Some parents asked about funding, and whether or not families are charged tuition, clearly unaware that to do so would be illegal. Many families were unclear of our requirements as a public school to provide individualized learning services or administer state mandated exams. Many were unaware that a charter school is a public school, and that the South Shore Charter Public School is no exception to the rules and regulations determined by the Massachusetts Department of Education.

Every year Phi Delta Kappan, a national organization for educators, conducts an annual poll of the public's attitude toward public schools. The results of the 46th annual poll were telling for charter schools. Fourteen years ago, when SSCPS was seven years old, Phi Delta Kappan began polling the general public about their opinion and knowledge of charter schools. By 2014, 50 percent of those polled knew that a charter school is a public school, reflecting an increase from 45 percent in 2009 and 39 percent in 2006. Only 40 percent of those polled knew that charter schools are not permitted to charge families tuition, an increase from 39 percent in 2009 and 29 percent in 2006. Lastly, 68 percent of those polled nationally believed the incorrect assumption that charter schools can select students on the basis of ability; down from 71 percent in 2009, but up from 58 percent in 2006. In light of this, our Open Houses provide the opportunity of not only talking about the curriculum and programming of our school, but also of informing families of school-age children about charter schools and their role in the landscape of public school education in the United States.

Of course, the best part of our Open House is combination of students, parents, and faculty who generously donate their time to answer questions, provide unique insights, and clarify misconceptions. We are exceedingly grateful to all volunteers who helped make last Saturday so successful. Thank you. As this year's enrollment season enters full swing, we anticipate many applications and another full Open House on Wednesday, January 14, 2015.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. **South Shore Charter Public School** offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.75; lunch costs \$3.25. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch.

- 1. Do I need to fill out an application for each child? No. Complete only one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Charlene Evans, Food Services Coordinator, 781-982-4202.
- 2. Who can get free meals? All children in households receiving benefits from MA SNAP, MA TAFDC or the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.



If you have received a NOTICE OF DIRECT CERTIFICATION for free meals, do not complete the application. But do let the school know if any children in your household are not listed on the Notice of Direct Certification letter you received.

- 3. CAN FOSTER CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Yes, foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court, are eligible for free meals.
- 4. Can homeless, runaway, and migrant children get free meals? Yes, children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals. If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail Angie Pepin, 7-12 Principal, 781-982-4202 or apepin@sscps.org.
- 5. WHO CAN GET REDUCED PRICE MEALS? Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Eligibility Income Chart, shown on this application.
- 6. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school at **781-982-4202** if you have questions.
- 7. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT ANOTHER ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 8. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILD(REN) GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.
- 9. Will the information I give be checked? Yes and we may also ask you to send written proof.
- 10. If I don't qualify now, may I apply later? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.

- 11. What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Alicia Savage at 781-982-4202 or email asavage@sscps.org or by mail to 100 Longwater Circle, Norwell, MA 02061.
- 12. May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen? Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be U.S. citizens to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
- 13. Who should I include as members of my household? You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends) who share income and expenses. You must include yourself and all children living with you. If you live with other people who are economically independent (for example, people who you do not support, who do not share income with you or your children, and who pay a pro-rated share of expenses), do not include them.
- 14. What if my income is not always the same? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 15. We are in the military. do we include our housing allowance as income? If you get an off-base housing allowance, it must be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income.
- 16. My spouse is deployed to a combat zone. is her combat pay counted as income? No, if the combat pay is received in addition to her basic pay because of her deployment and it wasn't received before she was deployed, combat pay is not counted as income. Contact your school for more information.
- 17. *My family needs more help. Are there other programs we might apply for?* To find out how to apply for MA SNAP or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or call the MA SNAP Hotline **1-866-950-3663**

SHARING INFORMATION WITH MEDICAID/SCHIP

Dear Parent/Guardian:

If your children get free or reduced price school meals, they <u>may</u> also be able to get free or low-cost health insurance through Medicaid or the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP). Children with health insurance are more likely to get regular health care and are less likely to miss school because of sickness.

Because health insurance is so important to children's well-being, the law allows us to tell Medicaid and SCHIP that your children are eligible for free or reduced price meals, unless you tell us not to. Medicaid and SCHIP only use the information to identify children who may be eligible for their programs. Program officials may contact you to offer to enroll your children. Filling out the Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application does not automatically enroll your children in health insurance.
