



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The South Shore Charter Public School held the annual Enrollment Lottery on Saturday, March 5, 2016. Although attending the Enrollment Lottery is not a requirement for admission, many families attend they will know that day whether or not their child has been accepted. As many of you may remember from your own experiences with the Enrollment Lottery, this day can be one of wonderful news, or not so great news, depending on the order in which your child's name is pulled out of the bowl. As we all know, gaining admission to the South Shore Charter Public School is completely random. The reality being the state mandates all charter schools base admissions on a system of chance.

This year the South Shore Charter Public School received a record number of applications, 1166 on or before the application deadline. This is the highest number of applications the School has ever received. For your comparison, please find Table I below, this table illustrates the number of applications we have received over the past five years.

In case you ever wanted to know, reading through 1166 names takes just over three hours. Many members of our school community have asked me why our school has received this tremendous increase in applications. In the past week, over ten new families directly told me that they applied for their child after speaking with parents of our current students. I strongly believe it is your positive communication about our school that has driven this increase. Thank you.

Although most applicants do not gain admission on lottery day, there is some good news. This year we were able to offer 201 openings due to the expansion. The way the number of openings is determined is by using three data points, first we look at current enrollment, then we review data taken from Letters of Intent, and lastly we used our recently approved Growth Plan. These three elements served as guides to develop Table II below.

Families who came to the Lottery on March 5 were able to read that table and see how many openings were available at their child's grade level. This table is posted throughout the School good on lottery day. The other table posted on lottery day is below. Table III indicates the number of applications we receive from surrounding districts. It is interesting data for our school as we use it to identify trends in those public school systems that make up our sending districts.




