



#### FROM THE 7-12 PRINCIPAL

The third quarter is quickly coming to an end as grades close for K-11 students on Friday. We will distribute report cards next week before leaving for a well-deserved spring break. While our teachers are working hard to deliver the remaining curriculum, they are also thinking ahead to next year. At the high school level we are determining our course offerings for 2016-2017 and informing students of their choices. While the majority of the courses in each department are available for students every year as they are part of a sequential curriculum building to a capstone course, there are some areas of flexibility. These options are growing as opportunities open with our expansion. Our science department recently surveyed the student body to determine the areas of greatest interest. This information, combined with student need, helps us decide on the courses to rotate in to complement the core Biology, Chemistry, and Physics courses available every year.

For 2016-2017 we are excited to expand the number of Advanced Placement (AP) options available to our students. Our rising juniors and seniors will be able to choose from AP Language and Composition, AP Literature and Composition, AP Calculus AB, AP Statistics, AP Biology, and AP Computer Science Principles. Students interested in AP Physics can take the course in 2017-2018 as it is offered in alternating years.

Expansion of our Advanced Placement program means increased access to more challenging coursework for a greater number of students. AP courses are significantly more rigorous than high school college preparatory courses and are comparable to courses taught at the college level. They move rapidly and cover a great deal of content, providing high school students with the opportunity to delve deeply into a subject of interest.

The curriculum for each course is based on a set of topics and objectives put together by a committee sponsored by The College Board, the same organization that publishes the SAT. Our AP teachers use these topics and objectives as a guideline for their curriculum. Each course culminates in an objective-based exam administered during the first weeks of May. If a student passes an AP exam, then he/she may receive college credit and/or be able to place out of an introductory course. Colleges differ in what scores and courses they will accept for credit. Colleges look favorably on students who do well in AP courses, as success in these courses indicates that students can achieve college-level standards. The presence of AP courses on a student's transcript indicates that a student took the most rigorous courses available. Research finds that students who take AP courses are more likely than their peers to complete a bachelor's degree in four years and that students who do well on an AP exam are academically prepared to place out of a corresponding introductory college course and move to the next-higher level course. Students who take an AP course, even those who score a 1 or a 2 on the exam, outperform their peers when they take the corresponding course at the college level. I encourage families to consider taking advantage of the opportunity these courses provide. If a student is interested in a course that we do not currently offer, I encourage them to consider taking the course virtually through our membership in the Virtual High School Collaborative (VHS). Our students have had positive experiences with their AP classes. More information about VHS and a course catalog can be found at: thevhscollaborative.org

I provided sophomores and juniors interested in AP with informational packets at today's morning meeting. Any student who did not get one today can stop by my office for the paperwork. I am also happy to provide the information electronically to families. AP contracts are due back on Tuesday, April 26th. As always, please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions.

#### PARENTS ASSOCIATION AD HOC EXPANSION COMMITTEE NEWS

The Parents Association has established an Ad Hoc Expansion Committee. One of the goals of this committee is to provide an additional opportunity for families to pose questions during the expansion process. Last night the PA held its monthly meeting, and this morning, an informational coffee regarding expansion was held in the music room. Each Weekly Update will feature some of the questions that have surfaced during these discussions, as well as questions submitted directly to the committee chairs, Danette Carter and Tara Dusthimer. Q: Are all the classrooms in the new building on the same floor?

A: Yes, there will be 23 classrooms on the first floor and we have 20,000 square feet of space. There will be a conference room, a nurse's office, student bathrooms, and a great room. There will be 105 parking spots available, including student parking.

Q: Will there be a staggered pick up time?

A: At this time, pickup and drop off times will be the same for both buildings. We have decided to keep procedures the same for now, and modify later if needed.

Q: Will there still be Morning Meeting?

A: Yes, we fully intend to continue with morning meetings as that is an important part of our school culture. The new space will have a great room that will be approximately 2,050 square feet.

One of the overarching questions most frequently asked pertains to our identity as a K-12 school. Most specifically, what the opportunities for students to work and interact with younger or older on other levels will be. The students, faculty, parents, and staff are committed to this element of our school and will continue to create opportunities for cross level student interaction. We look forward to addressing this question in more detail, and continuing the expansion discussion at our next informational coffee on Wednesday morning, May 11 at 8:30am in the music room.




