## From the 7-12 Principal

May is an incredibly busy time in the life of our school. The calendar is packed as our students and teachers work to complete the cycle of the school year with many culminating field trips, Project and Workshop events, standardized tests, and opportunities for community service. While testing has its place, I'd like to draw attention to other events that are engaging our students and fulfilling our mission outside of the classroom. Our faculty does a terrific job of broadening the education of students by working to provide opportunities beyond the scope of traditional academics.

This past weekend a group of eight high school girls chaperoned by Emily Merwin and Elyse Tengstrand took a trip up to the Hammerstone School of Carpentry for Women in Trumansburg, New York. Over the course of three days,
 the girls worked together through a combination of class time and hands on learning to gain basic carpentry skills. The result of their hard work, four beautiful wooden planters, now decorate the front entrance to the building. They are all ready to be planted for graduation! While a couple of the girls have some experience with carpentry through the Design, Build, Repair Workshop, for most this was a completely new experience. They were forced to face fears, some that they did not even know they had, and overcome them. The girls had the opportunity to practice a range of skills from sharpening a carpenter's pencil to using basic power tools. Pushing into areas of discomfort was made easier through teamwork. The girls were able to support each other as they ventured into new territory. They were well prepared to approach a novel experience by the group work skills our school fosters and values. By the end of the three days, all of the girls were comfortable with their tools, grabbing things from their tool belts as
 if they had been doing it for years, not days. Other highlights of the trip included a personal tour of Cornell University, camping, and visiting local attractions such the 215 foot high Taughannock waterfall. Thank you to Emily and Elyse for taking the time to give our students this experience.

Monday marked the first annual Day of Service for Level IV. The day was a great opportunity for students to learn more about the area while providing a much needed service. Students from the Level spent the day picking up trash along the Cape Cod Canal, just in time for the start of the summer season. Some students had never been to the Cape, while most had never seen it from the vantage point of the canal. Students were impressed with the area, especially by the lobster traps they discovered in their travels. After the clean-up, the Level toured the canal visitor's center, learned how the canal was built from members of the Army Corps of Engineers, and watched a tugboat guide a barge through the canal. When the vans arrived back at school students needed time to lie down in the grass and recover from a day of hard work. That is evidence of an excellent field trip. Thank you to Jody Regan for working to organize this event. I know that plans are already in the works for next year.

As the school year winds down, I hope that everyone takes the time to attend some of the events that make our calendar so full. If you can only choose one, please plan to come to graduation the morning of June 4th. As always, do not hesitate to reach out with any questions or concerns.
