I love that the Update provides me with a forum to reflect on what is happening at school and to provide families with important information. It is a wonderful communication tool. My favorite weeks to write are the weeks when I have the privilege of celebrating the successes of our students. This is one of those weeks. Last Friday I had the public opportunity to celebrate high student achievement at our annual National Honor Society induction ceremony. Our student body, faculty, staff, and many families came together to recognize the achievements of our nine newest NHS members.

The National Association of Secondary School Principals established the National Honor Society in 1921 to recognize outstanding high school students. While we have some flexibility in dictating how our chapter is run, the national organization sets the guidelines and determines the standards for membership. Induction into the National Honor Society recognizes student excellence in four areas: scholarship, leadership, community service, and character. These four areas serve as the basis of the National Honor Society and also reflect the values of our school's mission: inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life.

Our prospective NHS members undergo a rigorous selection process that requires students to reflect on the meaning of academics, leadership, service, and character and honestly present how they demonstrate these qualities to a faculty selection committee. Our chapter of the National Honor Society is active and visible in our building. With the guidance of their advisor, Emily Merwin, NHS students regularly plan service projects to benefit both our school and the wider community. These service projects include peer tutoring, blood drives, and volunteering at shelters. NHS students take on a leadership role in the building through formal means such as presentations to the student body, and in an informal way by serving as role models for our younger students. Last week the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education awarded John and Abigail Adams scholarships to members of the class of 2016. I am proud to announce the thirteen recipients from South Shore Charter Public School:

The scholarship provides a tuition waiver for up to eight semesters of undergraduate coursework at a Massachusetts state college or university. High School Seniors become eligible for the scholarship when they score at the Advanced performance level on one of the three high school state assessment tests in ELA, Mathematics, or Science; and score at the Proficient level or higher on the remaining two high school state assessment tests; and have combined scores from the three tests that place them in the top 25 percent of students in the graduating class in their graduating class at SSCPS or in their sending district. While tuition accounts for only a small percentage of

the cost of attending a public college or university, over the course of four years the scholarship can save students up to \$7000. It is also an important public recognition of a significant academic achievement.

This year we also have two students that the National Merit Scholarship Corporation has named Commended Scholars based on their performance on the 2014 PSAT. This honor was only granted to approximately 34,000 of the 1.5 million juniors who took the PSAT last fall. Commended Scholars make up approximately the top two percent of test takers. I'd like to congratulate **Jeremy Atkins** and **Van Harting** for earning this distinction.

I extend my congratulations not only to the students mentioned above, but to the families and teachers who have supported their achievements. You all have a great deal to be proud of.
