



#### FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

One of the reasons our school is so strong is that so many of our families are part of the fabric of our school. Whether you come in for your child's Exhibition of Mastery, or are volunteering in the library, or just bringing in a lunch left on the kitchen counter amidst the early morning rush, part of your day is undoubtedly linked to your child's schooldays. Many of you may have noticed some new faces over the past three months. There have been some faculty changes and new additions as this year has progressed.

Since January we have had two faculty transitions at the high school. Math teacher Ed Dormady has taken on a new role as SAT/ACT tutor for our new test preparation program. Ed now teaches some of our students on Saturday and on Thursday Ed runs an AP Calculus FIT. Taking Ed's place in the classroom is Nahoko Vigneau.
