



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As the day's temperature looms near ninety degrees, it becomes increasingly apparent that the "home stretch" of the school year is rapidly approaching. This week students are taking the math MCAS and laptop carts ready for this online assessment may be found on Levels II, III, IV, and at the high school. The MCAS is no small endeavor and our students have risen to the challenge. I would like to thank all of our families who have laid the groundwork for these testing days. What happens at home is important; please know that all you do to ensure your child is ready to learn each day makes a difference.

Last week marked the second and final week of AP testing. If your child is taking one or more AP exam, you know the results are important. Those students who receive a score of three, four, or five on the exam may be able to use the AP course for college credits. Our high school students should be commended for completing this rigorous coursework and doing their best.

Included in this week's update is the list of college acceptances for members of the senior class. This impressive list is the result thoughtful planning and hard work. Few children are able to reach their dreams alone; behind each college acceptance is a supportive family who stood by their child during late nights, long weekends, and interesting mornings. Now is the time to enjoy all that your children have accomplished. A special thank you is due to those family members who, in working with our guidance counselor, Mary Carter, as well as our faculty and staff, were able to assist our seniors in reaching high and succeeding.

I would like to also thank all who took the time to complete the Annual SSCPS Parent Satisfaction Survey. The results of the survey have been recorded and are <u>attached</u> for your review. Of the 493 families we have this year, we received 114 responses. This is a good response, yet fewer than last year's 166 responses out of 372 families. Last year we had forty more responses than the 2015 survey. We believe that last year's increase in survey participation was a direct result of the upcoming school expansion. This year has been our first year of significant enrollment growth. We have used all data gleaned from last year's report to assist with determining the direction of our programming, school culture, and expansion priorities. Overall, we are pleased with how the increase in our student population has occurred. However, there are some challenges that come with growth. These challenges have been learning opportunities throughout the year.

This year, we have used the survey feedback as another data point as we plan for our growth over the next three years. One need that stood out was the importance of improving our technology. Another articulated need was the importance of improving our facilities. On our wish list are a second larger gym, athletic fields, and more outdoor space. Last Thursday evening, the Board of Trustees reviewed the survey results and we will be using these results once again to inform much of the discussion over the summer. Your input is essential to our growth and sustainability and we welcome any additional thoughts you may have.

Thank you again for being a part of the South Shore Charter Public School. We could not be all that we are without you.
