## FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Yesterday marked the last day of school for our kindergarten students. It is hard to believe how much they have grown from the children we met last June at kindergarten screenings. Just a few weeks ago, I was treated to lunch in Kassandra's room. Our youngest students were so grown up that I felt like I was having high tea even though I was sitting in a very small chair. One of my favorite moments was when one young lady sitting on my right suddenly started missing her mom. Within seconds, a young man who was eating his lunch on the other side of the table jumped to his feet, went to a cubby to retrieve a small stuffed animal, and quickly placed it in her lap. This fast-thinking action changed a frown to a smile, allowing us all to continue the delightful conversation. This year's kindergarten students are a kind and thoughtful group. I am sure they will do a wonderful job in August as ambassadors to Level I when our new kindergarten students begin their very own SSCPS experience.

## COMMUNITY INTEREST

Hello! It has been my privilege and pleasure to be teaching Emily Lincoln's K - 4 fabulous Art students this year for her. The kids are so creative and enthusiastic, and it has been a joy to be working with them.

Drawing is a skill, and summer is a good time to practice it regularly. I get most of my art supplies at Ocean State Job Lot. They have a lot of reasonably priced materials there and I encourage you to get hardbound sketchbooks for your children to use. In this age of screens and ever increasing technology, the hands on process of art making is so important!

There are so many fabulous children's book illustrators to look at and be inspired by at libraries. Born in 1866, young Beatrix Potter wasn't allowed to go to school because she was a girl. She spent years observing and sketching animals and the natural world, it shows in her wonderful series of Peter Rabbit books. Check out Patricia Polacco's terrific drawings with color in her many picture books, as well as Brian Selznick's amazing pencil drawings in his prize winning book - *The Invention of Hugo Cabret* - which is also a movie!

Working with clay is also a lot of fun. You can buy a good air dry clay called Mexican Pottery Clay in 5 pound boxes at Michaels. The great thing about this clay is that you can press beads, feathers, shells, etc. into the artwork and when it dries you can paint it, if you'd like. This is the clay that Level 1 students used for their finger puppets and Level 2 students used for their small *netsuke* sculptures. Portland Pottery in Braintree also carries bigger boxes of air dry clay.

Looking for an art field trip? The Fuller Craft Museum [[www.fullercraft.org](http://www.fullercraft.org)] in Brockton has great exhibits and also workshops, camp, and community art days. The DeCordova Museum [[www.decordova.org](http://www.decordova.org)] in Lincoln has a huge outdoor sculpture park - a great place to picnic - as well as a cool art museum. Marshfield artist Sally Dean is showing fantastic paintings of animals at the Ventress Memorial Library [[www.ventresslibrary.org](http://www.ventresslibrary.org)] in Marshfield until June 30th. Some of my clay animal sculptures are also in nearby shows. This weekend, at the South Shore Art Center Festival [[www.ssac.org](http://www.ssac.org)] my bear woman sculpture called *Artemis* is on display under the tent. *Seal with Hat* can be seen upstairs at the Frame Center [Rt.53] as a part of the Hanover Day Art Exhibit [[www.hanoverday.com](http://www.hanoverday.com)] until July 14th.
