



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

This past week has posed an unfortunate challenge. Hurricane Matthew has created an element of uncertainty for those of us with loved ones in the storm's path. Our hearts go out to all of our families, particularly those with family members in Haiti, who are waiting to hear or have received news. Donation boxes for Catholic Relief Services will be stationed at the front desks of 100 Longwater Circle and 700 Longwater Drive beginning tomorrow and throughout all of next week for those of us who would like to make cash contributions.

In other news the Massachusetts Department of Education (ESE) publically released assessment and accountability data on September 26, 2016. Our families should have received individual student scores on last spring's MCAS and PARCC assessments earlier this week. Using this data, as well as our school's graduation rate, and dropout rate, the South Shore Charter Public School has been designated as a Level 2 district. There are five levels. If a school scores at a four or five, the ESE begins interventions. Most schools are either Level 1 or Level 2. Our school has maintained a Level 2 rating throughout the transition from MCAS to PARCC over the past three years. Being the lower of two top levels, Level 2 is not an accountability rating that requires assistance from the state, nor is it one that requires an intervention plan.

Over the past five years, the South Shore Charter Public School has been redirecting efforts away from the old MCAS and moving towards student assessments that serve as one of the gatekeepers for entrance into higher education. It was for this reason that our school was one of the first to pilot the PARCC in the spring of 2014. Many of you may remember this testing in math if you had children on Level II in grade three. Since that time we have been using student data taken from both the PARCC and the MCAS as one of the elements that inform our instruction.

One positive aspect of the PARCC, and now of the new MCAS, is that both assessments more closely align with the SAT and the ACT than their predecessor. It is important for families to understand that the old tenth grade MCAS, although it continues to be a high stakes test, is not an assessment seen by colleges and universities. Creating an even more difficult path for students in public schools is that over the last twenty years, the old MCAS had been diluted to a basic literacy test once students reached grade ten. Students could achieve a score of *Advanced* or *Proficient* on the tenth grade MCAS test, only to be confounded upon taking the SAT or ACT used to determine college admission.

Although a discrepancy between a state sponsored diploma ready assessment and a college admission test persists, the gap is distinctively narrower should the state retain the rigor of last year's PARCC assessment, which will now be called MCAS. The Common Core standards are no stranger to Massachusetts. These are the standards that have been introduced nationwide over the past three years. These new standards are to adhere to the learning standards and objectives outlined by The College Board. It is important for families to realize that the Common Core standards are mostly what schools in Massachusetts have been doing all along. So called "examples" of Common Core math or English classwork frequenting social media sites are misrepresentations usually reflecting teachers struggling with methodology and interpretation; these are not examples of actual learning standards.

It is also important for all of us to realize that student learning goals and curriculum standards are moving targets that grow and change and we recognize the need to redesign some of the curriculum at key points.

One of those points is mathematics. Shortly after administering the trial run of the PARCC on Level II, our math teachers looked at many of the equations our third grade students were being asked to solve. Once the testing laptops were folded up and put away, teachers were able to reflect and identify points where the curriculum was not aligned. Although some aspects of Singapore Math were apparent in the PARCC assessment, the gaps between the curriculum and the assessment were significant. Consequently the math program no longer aligned with the new assessment. Through professional development with Bill Atwood, and much hard work and research, Darlene Parker and Krista Cafourek came upon Eureka Math. Sensing that this new math program would provide our students with the learning standards our students needed, last year Level II ran a pilot of Eureka Math. Teachers discovered that Eureka Math allowed for greater mastery of a more broad scope of material than Singapore Math. Last spring teachers determined that it would be beneficial to all students to make the curriculum switch and so begins the first year of K-6 Eureka Math implementation.

It is now October and there has been some time for feedback from our teachers. In speaking with Darlene last week she reported some interesting facts. Because both programs use similar language and concepts, the transition to Eureka Math has gone smoothly. There are many positive elements of the new program; comprehensive modeling of word problems, a spiraling element of math fluency, and materials that have led students to another way of thinking about mental math. So far, the reviews I have heard have all been positive.

One constant to learning math is the hard work of our students and the commitment of our teachers. Without serious effort, no curriculum will be effective. We are exceedingly fortunate to be able to try new programs and to be able to implement them with fidelity. I encourage you, as your child’s first teacher, to review your child’s math materials and let us know if you have any thoughts or questions.

Alicia Savage, Executive Director of the South Shore Charter Public School, was informed by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education of an upcoming Coordinated Program Review that will be taking place this school year. As part of this Coordinated Program Review, Department staff will visit the South Shore Charter Public School during the week of October 10th. Such visits are routinely conducted by the Department to satisfy federal and state requirements for the periodic review of specific education programs and services in schools throughout the Commonwealth. The Department is reviewing several programs during a single visit in order to use Department and school staff's time most efficiently and to encourage strong connections among the programs.

The Department's Coordinated Program Review will address the following programs: Special Education, English Language Education, and Civil Rights. After reviewing South Shore Charter Public School's procedures for these programs, a Department team will make its onsite visit, during which it will review individual student records, interview administrators, teachers and paraprofessional staff, survey parents and observe instructional spaces. After the onsite visit it will prepare a report for the Executive Director and the Board of Trustees, with detailed findings for each program.

Using a scale of ratings ranging from "Commendable" to "Not Implemented," the report will rate the implementation of each requirement reviewed by the Department. Where requirements are found not implemented or only partially implemented, South Shore Charter Public School must propose to the Department corrective action to bring those areas into compliance with statutes and regulations. Districts and schools are encouraged to incorporate the corrective action into their district and school improvement plans and professional development plan. The South Shore Charter Public School will be provided with technical assistance from the Department in developing a corrective action plan. Both the Department's report and the corrective action plan are public information and will be available to the public upon request. Program Review Final Reports are also available on the Department's Internet website at <<http://www.doe.mass.edu/pqa/review/cpr/reports/>>.

Any member of the public may request to be interviewed by telephone by a member of the Department's visiting team. Those wishing to be interviewed should call the South Shore Charter Public School at 781-982-4202 no later than October 7, 2016 to leave their name and phone number, or they may call the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education at (781) 338-3737. A member of the visiting team will contact each person desiring an interview within two weeks after the completion of the onsite visit. If an individual is not comfortable communicating in English or requires some other accommodation, the Department will make arrangements to communicate appropriately with the individual.
