



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Today, the South Shore Charter Public School will hold its annual enrollment lottery.

At 2:00 p.m. we will be welcoming 125 new students and their families to our school community. It is an important day for many families who have filled out an application and are now waiting to see what the outcome will be.

This year there will be a change in how we conduct the lottery. The process and results will remain random. However, there will be no manual drawing of each child's name from a glass bowl. This will be the first year we hold the enrollment lottery electronically.

This year we received 1161 applications for 125 openings. Over the past three years the increase in the number of enrolled students has allowed more students and families to become part of our school community. This year we are once again pleased to be able to offer more seats to students throughout the south shore.

In the weeks leading up to the enrollment lottery, teachers and the administrative team reviewed the current educational programming and looked at the future strategically to make some decisions about enrollment numbers. At 100 Longwater Circle, we are considering a plan to enlarge two classrooms and create one additional classroom over the summer to accommodate additional students into our program. This decision, as with all enrollment decisions, was made within the parameters of our growth plan. We continue to use the growth plan to outline the size of each level.

Anticipated openings are determined by the number of students we have in a grade during a current year, the number of students who have indicated they will be returning, and the target number for each grade. Table I indicates the pre-enrollment number of students, the number of sibling applications, the number of students we will be accepting today, and the total enrollment for the upcoming school year.

Table II indicates the number of applications received, the number of siblings who have applied at each grade level, and the number of applications we receive from each sending district. Weymouth (318), Randolph (203), and Brockton (143) represent the highest number of applications.

We are exceedingly fortunate to have families seeking admission from so many wonderful communities throughout the south shore.




