



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Every year in May the Finance Committee of the South Shore Charter Public School puts forward the annual budget for the upcoming school year. At the May Board of Trustees Meeting, the Committee presents the budget where it is discussed and voted on by our Trustees. On May 10, 2018, Kristine Bingham, Director of Finance, presented the School's budget on the slides below.

The presentation covers a range of items that go into determining a school budget. We review the past year's finances and programming. Using data gleaned from the parent and faculty surveys, we look at the educational programming and school environment and use that information to shape how resources are distributed. The finance presentation also articulates some of the organizational changes for the upcoming year.

Each slide provides information you may find interesting. Slide three reviews final numbers from this year giving detailed information about per-pupil tuition revenues, DESE grants, and our Charter School Expansion Grant. Slides four and five are an overview of the budget highlights for the upcoming year. On these slides you will see that the number of additional students accepted for next year is sixty. You will also see that we will be adding additional faculty members to support student needs and that there will be ongoing curriculum development. We will be building three new classrooms at 100 Longwater over the summer.

Slide six addresses the program enhancements beginning and continuing in the upcoming year. We have had many new wonderful programs this year, including college preparation with Chyten, our dual enrollment program, as well as Wit & Wisdom. We anticipate the upcoming school year will be another of school growth and improvements.

Slide seven provides a list of anticipated positions for the 2018-2019 school year. We are very excited to add four K-12 Curriculum Directors for English Language Arts, Mathematics, History, and Science. We will be hiring for those four positions in early June. We will be adding a school adjustment counselor and a college placement guidance counselor. We will also be adding two teachers and two tutors on Level I, a Level IV History teacher, a Level IV Science teacher, a Learning Services teacher, a part-time ESL teacher, and a part-time Spanish teacher, as well as additional support personnel. We did much hiring last summer and throughout this school year to meet the needs of our student population and we anticipate similar circumstances for the upcoming year.

Slide eight charts the School's income and expenses, while slide nine gives a pie chart visual of from where our revenues generate. Slide ten provides some demographic information regarding our sending districts. Slides eleven and twelve contain pie graphs showing where our expenditures will be for the upcoming school year. As you can see, seventy-nine percent of our expenditures are dedicated to salaries and benefits, eighty-eight percent of salaries are for instructional services. This is exactly where we want to put our resources, towards recruiting and retaining an outstanding faculty.

Slide thirteen illustrates revenue and expense trends. Slide fourteen shows four items that make up our total capital request, technology, HVAC equipment, classroom and building renovations, and a new van and slide fifteen presents the cash flow projection for the upcoming school year. Lastly, we end with some of the ongoing facility concerns that have been articulated by our school community, parents, faculty, and the administration. These include additional programming spaces, shared faculty areas, athletic facilities, performance and fine art spaces, additional parking at 100 Longwater Circle, and some landscape design to improve traffic flow. We continue to

work on these school improvements and look forward to addressing these needs when we begin our work on the new strategic plan.

I would like to thank the Finance Committee, led by Edwin Rivera, and Kristine Bingham, and the Finance Office, for all of their work on the school budget. We are looking forward to a great year. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to email.

Wellspring

As of April 1st SNAP (food stamps) recipients and those interested in becoming SNAP recipients here on the south shore will no longer have to travel or call Quincy or Brockton for assistance. Wellspring is now a DTA Community Partner and will be able to handle all SNAP (food stamp) applications and re-certifications. We will also be able to complete interim reports and help trouble shoot any issues that arise with benefit coverage. Sober Parenting Journey (SPJ). Wellspring is proudly partnering with South Shore Peer Recovery to offer this evidence supported program. SPJ is a 14 week workshop where participants meet weekly in a small group setting for 2 hours. The class is free to all participants and included complimentary childcare and dinner. Parents and caregivers in recovery face the additional challenge of building strong, positive relationships with their children while maintaining their sobriety, which can be both rewarding and daunting. Sober Parenting Journey provides a valuable source of fellowship and support and enhances awareness of potential triggers that may escalate relapse. Registration ends April 15th for this class.

SCHOOL MEALS (BREAKFAST AND LUNCH)

Children need healthy meals to learn. The South Shore Charter Public School offers healthy meals every school day. Your children may qualify for free meals or reduced price meals.

If your child(ren) was eligible for free or reduced meal benefits last year, this does not automatically qualify your family for benefits this academic year. Your family MUST complete a NEW 2017-2018 Meal Benefit application and return it to Charlene Evans, Food Services Coordinator at SSCPS, UNLESS you have received a notification letter from the school this academic year notifying your family of approval of direct certification of meal benefits. If a your family was notified of free and reduced meal benefit eligibility this academic year, Your family MUST still complete a lunch and breakfast order form for each student for each day they wish to accept a meal benefit. You are able to complete meal orders on a weekly or monthly basis.

How Did We Do?

- For FY18, the school projects an additional 5% in tuition revenue vs. budget due to higher DESE projected per pupil tuition revenues
- FY18 Average Per Pupil revenue \$13,825
- In FY18, the school received increased grant funding from DESE entitlement grants (Title I, Title II Part A, Title III and Title IV & Sped Program Grants)=\$100,000 additional
- In FY18, the school received \$275,000 in federal grant funding for a Charter School Program Expansion Grant.
 Funds were used to purchase new tech, curriculum, furniture and transportation costs for shuttle bus
- In FY18, the school anticipates an end of year quasi profit of \$949,771

FY19 Budget Highlights

Continue expansion adding additional 60 students in FY19

- Budget serves 965 students with a pre-enrollment of 980 students. This allows for shifts in enrollment all year. The school will budget \$13,825 in per pupil revenue
- Revenues are estimated to be \$14,217,329 which is 11% higher than budgeted in FY18 and 4% higher than actual FY18
- Expenditures are estimated to be \$14,174,318 which are 15% higher than budgeted and projected FY18. The bulk of this increase is due to the addition of 18 additional new faculty/staff in FY19
- Additional faculty is needed to support our student's needs, the K-12 academic program, additional classrooms, and curriculum development

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FY19 Budget Highlights (cont.)

- The budget funds the 2nd year of a 3 year faculty compensation and benefits agreement. Average faculty cost of living raise is 5%
- Instructional Leaders, Administration, and support staff received a 2% cost of living raise
- Five Faculty received Master's Degrees placing them on the Master's salary step in FY19
- · Budgeted 15% increase in health benefits due to rising premiums
- Budget Depreciation to allow for ongoing replacement of capital equipment and building improvements
- Continue to budget Contingency for unplanned expenses and revenue shortfalls
- Budget capital for new technology, van, equipment and leasehold improvements

SOBER PARENTING JOURNEY | PROGRAM

In Sober Parenting Journey, a small group of parents and caregivers meet for 2 hours a week for 14 weeks. The program includes activities, discussions, a family-style meal each session and complimentary childcare. Addiction is complicated and difficult to overcome. Parents and caregivers in recovery face the additional challenge of building strong, positive relationships with their children while maintaining their sobriety, which can be both rewarding and daunting. Sober Parenting Journey provides a valuable source of fellowship and support and enhances awareness of potential triggers that may escalate relapse. In a safe and caring setting, participants will explore past and present patterns of emotional regulation, compulsive thinking, and addictive behaviors that influence choices. With hard work and honesty, participants will create a new path that strengthens sobriety, accountability, and positive actions while facing the daily challenges of recovery.

This Sober Parenting Journey workshop is a Wellspring and South Shore Peer Recovery program made possible in part by HAPSA, Safe Harbor Cohasset Coalition, Hull Firefighters, Social Service League of Cohasset, Quincy Family Resource Center and Debby & John Flanagan.
