



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Yesterday our parent community received a letter regarding the resignation of our K-4 Principal, Ted Hirsch. Below please find an excerpt from the Executive Director Report made to the Board of Trustees on Thursday evening, October 12, 2017. The included section of the report provides an overview of the administrative model which will now begin in November with the search for a K-4 Assistant Principal. Our first priority remains ensuring a smooth transition for our students, particularly our youngest students in K-2, and that the teaching and learning happening every day continues to inspire every student to excel in academics, service, and life.

As a school, we have always sought methods to attract and retain high caliber faculty who are the strongest in their field. The 2013-2014 Strategic Plan states SSCPS remains committed to attracting and retaining an excellent faculty, and will vigorously support its continuing education and professional development. The school will provide competitive compensation and career-ladder opportunities to attract newcomers and to provide incentives for present faculty to remain at school. There was no question the opportunity for faculty growth needed to occur, the question was how as a school, we planned to execute this goal.


Prior to last year the administrative model was one K-6 Principal and one 7-12 Principal. In the spring of 2016 I made the administrative decision to change the leadership on Level III. This meant that for the 2016-2017 school year, the administrative model would be one K-4 Principal and one 5-12 Principal. This decision was based on the strengths of the leadership team we had at that time. During the roll out of this new model, I received information that there would no longer be personnel to fill the K-4 Principal position after next year. With this in mind, and with the growing student enrollment, planning for a new administrative model began.

Our school is fortunate. We have many highly effective teachers here at SSCPS. The question then became, not where do we find our new leaders, but instead, how do we transition those highly effective teachers to highly effective members of our leadership team. Fortunately, with the level coordinator and curriculum leadership positions, there were some scaffolds in place that provide those faculty members willing to transition into school leadership with some practical experience prior to moving into an administrative role.

One of the first models discussed and designed is illustrated in Figure I. This model consists of one K-12 Principal and three Assistant Principals. The strength of this model indicates that there would be one K-4 Assistant Principal, one 5-8 Assistant Principal, and one 9-12 Assistant Principal. After much discussion at the administrative level, this is the model that we found to be the most optimal based on the personnel who would be moving into these positions. This model would allow for three new positions and it would secure the opportunity for upward advancement when the time came.

The school was moving toward this model. As time would tell, the administrative changes made to Level III turned out to be solid ones for our school community. By moving Level III to a 5-12 umbrella, we witnessed significant improvements in teaching, learning, and professional collaboration. Since the beginning of last year, our school was moving forward in a very positive way. It was at this time that we solidified the plans for the upcoming school year.

However, seven months after we began this planning, I received news that there would be a reversal of a prior administrative decision. This meant that for the 2017-2018 academic school year the leadership model would be different. Instead of hiring three assistant principals, the school hired two. Consequently, the leadership model for the current school year is one K-4 Principal, one 5-12 Principal, one K-8 Assistant Principal, and one 9-12 Assistant Principal.

The leadership model for 2017-2018 is not what was originally intended. However, because of the high skill level of our new assistant principals, this model will more than sustain the needs of our school for this academic school year. For the 2018-2019 academic school year I believe that the most solid administrative model was the one initially designed, one K-12 Principal and three Assistant Principals.

The other area of leadership growth for the South Shore Charter Public School is in curriculum development. The next set of leadership opportunities will be curriculum based. Our school leadership model will be redesigned to include Curriculum Directors in Math K-12, Science K-12, Social studies/History K-12, English 5-12, and Literacy K-4. These five new leadership positions will be school-wide positions that will lead the school with the implementation of new curricula and dissemination of best practices on a larger stage. The new curriculum leadership positions, combined with the new Assistant Principal model, will create an Instructional Leadership Team (ILT) that will propel the South Shore Charter School into the next phase of institutional growth.

Of course, one of the greatest impediments to change is funding. Inherent in each of these positions is a teaching component and a professional development component. Not only will this keep the model cost effective, it will keep the positions live and current with the challenges and excitement teachers face in the classroom every day.

GAME CHANGE



On Thursday, October 12 twenty-four of our high school students were invited to the Game Change Summit at Gillette Stadium. The Game Change program is a grant sponsored by the NE Patriots and the Attorney General's office who have made a partnership to combat anti- violence through education. Students and teachers are trained to be Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP) through 3 intense days of training. We have received the grant three years standing and have been able to train 30 students and 5 teachers. The group then in turn, trains their peers and younger students. At the present time, last year's entire high school population was brought through individual sessions on Sexual Harassment, Gender Roles and Stereotypes, Bystander, Types of Abuse, Rape Culture and Consent. Having done this

intense work the AG's Office asked if our students would share their strategies, thoughts and program with other high schools throughout the Commonwealth at the Summit.

Our students were excited to be selected for such an honor.

The presentation skills, their ability to articulate with professionalism and poise beyond their years that very challenging subject matter and present to peers and a huge roomful of teens, adults, Attorney General Maura Healey, Patriots owner, Robert Kraft speaks highly about their character, supports and guidance that they receive from their families and educators. I was approached by so many adults who commented on those aspects about our students. I replied that they are great kids and added that we do presentations from K up so most students are comfortable with public speaking. That is not to say that they were not nervous because in prepping many said that they were but still were able to step out of their comfort zone and speak to what they believe was important and can make a difference.





These presentations were made by students who have worked years to hone these skills and also to trust themselves and their fellow students to step out in front of hundreds and speak up about equality, abuse, domestic violence, sexual harassment and rape culture.

Four of our students were individually selected to ask separate questions to Robert Kraft and Attorney General Maura Healy (Molly Sullivan, Jordan Lussier, Jeremiah Derolus, Naomie Zorrilla) and three were asked to do a film interview (Nnenne David, Jordan Lussier and Naomie Zorrilla).


ART NEWS

South Shore Charter Public School 2017-2018 Pickup Procedures

All of us share the common interest at dismissal time of getting all students safely and efficiently into their correct vehicles. Our first goal is safety. The second is an efficient system that treats everyone equitably. Following these procedures will help us maintain a positive school culture and neighborly relations with the other tenants of Assinippi Park. Please remember the following:

- The campus is closed to pick-up traffic before 3:00pm at both locations.
- Students in K-8 must be picked up at 100 Longwater Circle. Students residing in towns A-Q front door; students residing in towns R-W back door.
- Students in grades 9-12 should be picked up at 700 Longwater Drive unless they have a scheduled last period class at 100 Longwater.
- **Students may be picked up at the front or back doors only.** Other pick up points put student safety at risk. Pick up in other lots is trespassing. Please do not pick up your child in any neighboring parking lots.
- If you do not want to wait in line, you may find that planning to arrive between 3:15 and 3:25 works better for your family.
- There is no cell phone use while driving on campus during arrival and dismissal.
- To assist with traffic flow, please follow the traffic guard instructions as well as the lines and arrows painted on the pavement.
- The speed limit on campus is five miles per hour.
- All drivers are to stay in their cars and staff members will help your child get into the car.
- If your student or any student in your carpool is not present when you come to pick up that student, a staff member will ask you to pull into a designated waiting area to keep the line moving.
- Parents and guardians who are late to pick up their students must park and come to the front desk to sign out their child(ren).
- All high school students not picked up by 3:30 at the 700 Longwater campus will be escorted to 100 Longwater. There is no adult supervision.
- When an appointment requires an exact 3:00pm dismissal, we ask that you pick up your student at or before 2:30.
- Any person who does not cooperate with these procedures will be asked to meet with the Principals.
- SSCPS reserves the right to contact the local police and/or transport any student not picked up by 5:00pm, or any student left waiting for longer than half an hour following a school based event.
