FROM THE 5-12 PRINCIPAL

Thursday evening we celebrated thirteen of our high achieving eleventh and twelfth grade students at our annual National Honor Society induction ceremony. The National Association of Secondary School Principals established the National Honor Society in 1921 to recognize outstanding high school students. While we have some flexibility in dictating how our chapter is run, the national organization sets the guidelines and determines the standards for membership; that bar is set high. Induction into the National Honor Society recognizes student excellence in four areas: scholarship, leadership, service, and character. Students must show distinction in all four of these areas in order to be considered for membership. These four qualities serve not only as the foundation of the National Honor Society but they reflect the values of our school's mission: inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life.

Our perspective NHS members undergo a rigorous selection process that requires students to reflect on the meaning of academics, leadership, service, and character and honestly present how they demonstrate these qualities to a faculty selection committee. At the induction ceremony students discussed these traits and their importance while members of the faculty introduced students by sharing how they each exemplify these qualities. Our new inductees pledged their commitment to continued excellence. This year our chapter added a new element to the ceremony. All of our new inductees invited a teacher who has had a significant impact on their education to the induction. During the ceremony our students took time to recognize those teachers and their role in their development as students and as people. It was wonderful to have faculty representation at our NHS event from the high school, the lower Levels, and from outside districts.

The SSCPS chapter of the National Honor Society is active and visible in our building. With the guidance of their advisor, Jenny Kostka, NHS students regularly plan service projects to benefit both our school and the wider community. These service projects include peer tutoring, blood drives, and volunteering at shelters. NHS students take on a leadership role in the building through formal means such as presentations to the student body, and in an informal way by serving as role models for our younger students. What is the Outing Club?

The SSCPS MS Outing Club is a club where everyone in grades 5-8 is a member. It is a parent-designed idea to provide social opportunities for SSCPS Middle School Students. The events are not school sponsored.
