Our hallways and classrooms serve as a constant reminder of the joy children bring to learning every day. Tomorrow many of us will celebrate Thanksgiving, but it is all of those moments, those times of joy that our children bring to us, that make us truly grateful for our lives here at the South Shore Charter Public School.

Our school community is exceedingly grateful for the wonderful work of the National Honor Society. Our school community is also grateful for the work of our faculty and staff, school accountant Kerri Doble, staff member Karen Boyle, and of course, faculty member Bev Bruce. All three worked tirelessly throughout the week to ensure all would go well, and it did. This year parents and faculty sold 464 books, a school record, which amounted to \$4,448.44 in sales, a percentage of which we may now use to stock our school library and classrooms. We were grateful to receive 25 books donated by parents and staff for our library collection. Placing a book in a child's hand is truly one of life's best moments. Thank you to all who make it possible.

Lastly, I would like to recognize June and the students of the gardening project who made our annual Carrot Day so special. This year, instead of distributing carrots to everyone, June and her students decided to donate the carrots to the food pantry at the <u>Wellspring Multi-Service Center</u>, the <u>Hanover Food Pantry</u>, and the <u>Weymouth Food Pantry</u>. There were enough carrots to ensure that others may have fresh vegetables on their Thanksgiving table. The actions taken by our students on Carrot Day truly embodies the spirit of who we are as a school, bringing meaning to our mission of inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life.

If a your family was notified of free and reduced meal benefit eligibility this academic year, Your family MUST still complete a lunch and breakfast order form for each student for each day they wish to accept a meal benefit. You are able to complete meal orders on a weekly or monthly basis.

This is an <u>awesome</u> opportunity for us to show our gratitude for their service!


